Jeremiah 18:8" And that nation actually turns back from its badness against which I spoke, I will also feel regret over the calamity that I had thought to execute upon it.

- When your people Israel are defeated before the enemy, because they kept sinning against you, and they indeed return to you and laud your name and pray and make request for favor toward you in this house. (1 Kings 8:33)
- This is what Yehowah of armies, the God of Israel, has said; Make YOUR ways and YOUR dealings good, and I will keep YOU people residing in this place. (Jeremiah 7:3)
- Now as regards someone wicked, in case he should turn back from all his sins that he has committed and he should actually keep all my statutes and execute justice and righteousness, he will positively keep living. He will not die. (Ezekiel 18:21)
- Say to them; As I am alive, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah, I take delight, not in the death of the wicked one, but in that someone wicked turns back from his way and actually keeps living. Turn back, turn back from your bad ways, for why is it that you should die, O house of Israel? (Ezekiel 33:11)
- And the men of Nineveh began to put faith in God, and they proceeded to proclaim a fast and to put on sackcloth, from the greatest one of them even to the least one of them. (Jonah 3:5)
- And he would remember concerning them his covenant, and he would feel regret according to the abundance of his grand lovingkindness. (Psalms 106:45)
- Perhaps they will listen and return, each one from his bad way, and I shall have to feel regret for the calamity that I am thinking to execute upon them because of the badness of their dealings. (Jeremiah 26:3)
- And rip apart YOUR hearts, and not YOUR garments, and come back to Yehowah YOUR God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abundant in loving-kindness, and he will certainly feel regret on account of the calamity. (Joel 2:13)

- And the true God got to see their works, that they had turned back from their bad way, and so the true God felt regret over the calamity that he had spoken of causing to them, and he did not cause it. (Jonah 3:10)
- Hence he prayed to Yehowah and said; Ah, now, O Yehowah, was not this an affair of mine, while I happened to be on my own ground? That is why I went ahead and ran away to Tarshish, for I knew that you are a God gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abundant in loving-kindness, and feeling regret over the calamity. (Jonah 4:2)
- And they began to remove the foreign gods from their midst and to serve Yehowah, so that his soul became impatient because of the trouble of Israel. (Judges 10:16)
- I do regret that I have caused Saul to reign as king, because he has turned back from following me, and my words he has not carried out. And it was distressing to Samuel, and he kept crying out to Yehowah all night long. (1 Samuel 15:11)
- And now make YOUR ways and YOUR dealings good, and obey the voice of Yehowah YOUR God, and Yehowah will feel regret for the calamity that he has spoken against YOU. (Jeremiah 26:13)
- Perhaps those of the house of Judah will listen to all the calamity that I am thinking of doing to them, to the end that they may return, each one from his bad way, and that I may actually forgive their error and their sin. (Jeremiah 36:3)
- If you will without fail keep dwelling in this land, I will also build you up and I shall not tear you down, and I will plant you and I shall not uproot you, for I shall certainly feel regret over the calamity that I have caused to you. (Jeremiah 42:10)
- For not out of his own heart has he afflicted or does he grieve the sons of men. (Lamentations 3:33)
- Who is there knowing whether he will turn back and actually feel regret and let remain after it a blessing, a grain offering and a drink offering for Yehowah your God? (Joel 2:14)
- Who is there knowing whether the true God may turn back and actually feel regret and turn back from his burning anger, so that we may not perish? (Jonah 3:9)
