Jeremiah 1:16... And I will speak with them my judgments over all their badness, in that they have left me and they keep making sacrificial smoke to other gods¹ and bowing down to the works of their own hands.

- Yehowah will send upon you the curse, confusion and rebuke in every undertaking of yours that you try to carry out, until you have been annihilated and have perished in a hurry, because of the badness of your practices in that you have forsaken me. (Deuteronomy 28:20)
- The full wind itself comes even from these to me. Now I myself also shall speak forth the judgments with them. (Jeremiah 4:12)
- In case You should leave Yehowah and You do serve foreign gods, he also will certainly turn back and do You injury and exterminate You after he has done You good. (Joshua 24:20)
- Due to the fact that they have left me and have gone making sacrificial smoke to other gods in order to offend me with all the work of their hands, and my rage has been set afire against this place and will not be extinguished. (2 Kings 22:17)
- But if you yourselves turn back and actually leave my statutes and my commandments that I have put before you, and you actually go and serve other gods and bow down to them. (2 Chronicles 7:19)
- O Yehowah, the hope of Israel, all those who are leaving you will be put to shame. Those apostatizing from me will be written down even in the earth, because they have left the source of living water, Yehowah. (Jeremiah 17:13)
- And seventy men of the elderly ones of the house of Israel, with Jaazaniah the son of Shaphan standing in among them, were standing before them, each one with his censer in his hand, and the perfume of the cloud of the incense was ascending. (Ezekiel 8:11)
- They called them. To that same extent they went away from before them. To the Baal images they took up sacrificing, and to

the graven images they began making sacrificial smoke. (Hosea 11:2)

- And their land is filled with valueless gods. To the work of one's hands they bow down, to that which one's fingers have made. (Isaiah 2:8)
- So they made a calf in those days and brought up a sacrifice to the idol and began to enjoy themselves in the works of their hands. (Acts of Apostles 7:41)
- And that was the way he did for all his foreign wives who were making sacrificial smoke and sacrificing to their gods. (1 Kings 11:8)
- For who will show compassion upon you, O Jerusalem, and who will sympathize with you, and who will turn aside to ask about your welfare? (Jeremiah 15:5)
