Jeremiah 22:28" Is this man¹ Coniah a mere form despised, dashed to pieces, or a vessel in which there is no delight? Why is it that he himself and his offspring must be hurled down and thrown into the land that they have not known?

- As I am alive, is the utterance of Yehowah, even if Coniah the son of Jehoiakim, the king of Judah, happened to be the seal ring on my right hand, from there I would pull you off! (Jeremiah 22:24)
- And King Zedekiah the son of Josiah began to reign in place of Coniah the son of Jehoiakim, whom Nebuchadrezzar the king of Babylon made king in the land of Judah. (Jeremiah 37:1)
- When they got up early in the morning the very day after, there Dagon was fallen upon his face to the earth before the ark of Yehowah, with the head of Dagon and the palms of both his hands cut off, to the threshold. Only the fish part had been left upon him. (1 Samuel 5:4)
- Like someone dead and not in the heart, I have been forgotten, I have become like a damaged vessel. (Psalms 31:12)
- On all the roofs of Moab and in her public squares, all of it, there is wailing, for I have broken Moab just like a vessel in which there is no delight, is the utterance of Yehowah. (Jeremiah 48:38)
- Israel must be swallowed down. Now they must come to be among the nations, like a vessel in which there is no delight. (Hosea 8:8)
- Thus he took Jehoiachin into exile to Babylon, and the king's mother and the king's wives and his court officials and the foremost men of the land he led away as exiled people from Jerusalem to Babylon. (2 Kings 24:15)
- And he proceeded to set up the pillars in front of the temple, one to the right and one to the left, after which he called the name of the right-hand one Jachin and the name of the left-hand one Boaz. (2 Chronicles 3:17)

- Who had been taken into exile from Jerusalem with the deported people who were taken into exile with Jeconiah the king of Judah whom Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon took into exile. (Esther 2:6)
- Howl, you shepherds, and cry out! And wallow about, you majestic ones of the flock, because your days for slaughtering and for your scatterings have been fulfilled, and you must fall like a desirable vessel! (Jeremiah 25:34)
- That Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon had not taken when he carried Jeconiah the son of Jehoiakim, the king of Judah, into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon, together with all the nobles of Judah and Jerusalem. (Jeremiah 27:20)
