- And her prostitution occurred because of her frivolous view, and she kept polluting the **land** and committing adultery with stones and with trees. (**Jeremiah 3:9**)
- O that I had in the **wilderness** a lodging place of travelers! Then I would leave my people and go away from them, for all of them are adulterers, a solemn assembly of treacherous dealers. (**Jeremiah 9:2**)
- Your acts of adultery and your neighings, your loose conduct in prostitution. Upon the hills, in the field, I **have** seen your disgusting things. Woe to you, O Jerusalem! You cannot be clean, after how much longer? (**Jeremiah 13:27**)
- In the case of the wife that commits adultery, she takes strangers instead of her own husband. (**Ezekiel 16:32**)
- All of them are adulterers, like a furnace set burning by a baker, who ceases poking after kneading dough until it is leavened. (**Hosea 7:4**)
- How can I forgive you for this very thing? Your own sons **have** left me, and they keep swearing by what is no God. And I kept satisfying them, but they continued committing adultery, and to the house of a prostitute woman they go in troops. (**Jeremiah 5:7**)
- And with the wife of his companion a man **has** done a detestable thing, and his own daughter-in-law a man **has** defiled with loose conduct, and his sister, the daughter of his own father, a man **has** humiliated in you. (**Ezekiel 22:11**)
- There are the pronouncing of **curses** and practicing of deception and murdering and stealing and committing of adultery that **have**

broken forth, and acts of bloodshed **have** touched other acts of bloodshed. (**Hosea 4:2**)

- The **land has gone** to **mourning**, **has** faded away. The productive **land has** withered, **has** faded away. The high ones of the people of the **land have** withered. (**Isaiah 24:4**)
- How long should the **land** keep withering away, and the very vegetation of all the field dry up? Because of the badness of those dwelling in it the beasts and the flying creatures **have** been swept away. For they **have** said; He does not see our future. (**Jeremiah 12:4**)
- That is why the **land** will mourn and every inhabitant in it will **have** to fade away with the wild beast of the field and with the flying creature of the heavens, and even the fishes of the sea themselves will be gathered in death. (**Hosea 4:3**)
- The field **has** been despoiled, the ground **has gone** to **mourning**, for the grain **has** been despoiled, the new wine **has** been **dried** up, the oil **has** faded away. (**Joel 1:10**)
- Fruitful **land** into salt country, owing to the badness of those dwelling in it. (**Psalms 107:34**)
- Over the mountains I shall raise a weeping and lamentation, and over the **pasture grounds** of the **wilderness** a dirge, for they will **have** been burned so that there is no man passing through and people actually will not hear the sound of livestock. Both the flying creature of the heavens and the beast will **have** fled, they will **have gone**. (**Jeremiah 9:10**)
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
