

**Jeremiah 25:11** **And all this land must become a devastated place, an object of astonishment, and these nations will have to serve the king of Babylon seventy years.**

**[15] - References:**

- To fulfill Yehowah's word by the mouth of Jeremiah, until the land had paid off its Sabbaths. All the days of lying desolated it kept Sabbath, to fulfill **seventy years**. (**2 Chronicles 36:21**)
- In the first year of his reigning I myself, Daniel, discerned by the books the number of the **years** concerning which the word of Yehowah had occurred to Jeremiah the prophet, for fulfilling the devastations of Jerusalem, namely, **seventy years**. (**Daniel 9:2**)
- So the angel of Yehowah answered and said; O Yehowah of armies, how long **will** you yourself not show mercy to Jerusalem and to the cities of Judah, whom you **have** denounced these **seventy years**? (**Zechariah 1:12**)
- Say to all the people of the land and to the priests; When **you** fasted and there was a wailing in the fifth month and in the seventh month, and this for **seventy years**, did **you** really fast to me, even me? (**Zechariah 7:5**)
- And the **king** of **Babylon** proceeded to strike them down and put them to death at Riblah in the land of Hamath. Thus Judah went into exile from off its soil. (**2 Kings 25:21**)
- And I shall set it as a thing destroyed. It **will** not be pruned, nor **will** it be hoed. And it **must** come up with the thornbush and weeds, and upon the clouds I shall lay a command to keep from precipitating any rain upon it. (**Isaiah 5:6**)
- And it **must** occur in that day that Tyre **must** be forgotten **seventy years**, the same as the days of one **king**. At the end of **seventy years** it **will** happen to Tyre as in the song of a prostitute. (**Isaiah 23:15**)
- And I **will** make Jerusalem piles of stones, the lair of jackals, and the cities of Judah I shall make a desolate waste, without an inhabitant. (**Jeremiah 9:11**)
- This is what Yehowah the God of Israel has said; Like these good figs, so I shall regard the exiles of Judah, whom I **will** send away

- from this **place** to the land of the Chaldeans, in a good way. (**Jeremiah 24:5**)
- And all the **nations must serve** even him and his son and his grandson until the time even of his own land comes, and many **nations** and great **kings must** exploit him as a servant. (**Jeremiah 27:7**)
  - Finally Yehowah was no longer able to put up with it because of the badness of **YOUR** dealings, because of the detestable things that **YOU** had done, and so **YOUR** land came to be a **devastated place** and an **object of astonishment** and a malediction, without an inhabitant, as at this day. (**Jeremiah 44:22**)
  - And I **will** make the land a desolate waste, for the reason that they **have** acted unfaithfully, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah. (**Ezekiel 15:8**)
  - And they **will have** to know that I am Yehowah when I make the land a desolate waste, even a desolation, on account of all their detestable things that they **have** done. (**Ezekiel 33:29**)
  - And the land **must become** a desolate waste on account of its inhabitants, because of the fruit of their dealings. (**Micah 7:13**)
  - But it was the tent of Moloch and the star of the god Rephan that **YOU** took up, the figures which **YOU** made to worship them. Consequently I **will** deport **YOU** beyond **Babylon**. (**Acts of Apostles 7:43**)
