Jeremiah 25:11" And all this land must become a devastated place, an object of astonishment, and these nations will have to serve the king of Babylon seventy years.

- To fulfill Yehowah's word by the mouth of Jeremiah, until the land had paid off its Sabbaths. All the days of lying desolated it kept Sabbath, to fulfill seventy years. (2 Chronicles 36:21)
- In the first year of his reigning I myself, Daniel, discerned by the books the number of the years concerning which the word of Yehowah had occurred to Jeremiah the prophet, for fulfilling the devastations of Jerusalem, namely, seventy years. (Daniel 9:2)
- So the angel of Yehowah answered and said; O Yehowah of armies, how long will you yourself not show mercy to Jerusalem and to the cities of Judah, whom you have denounced these seventy years? (Zechariah 1:12)
- Say to all the people of the land and to the priests; When You fasted and there was a wailing in the fifth month and in the seventh month, and this for seventy years, did You really fast to me, even me? (Zechariah 7:5)
- And the king of Babylon proceeded to strike them down and put them to death at Riblah in the land of Hamath. Thus Judah went into exile from off its soil. (2 Kings 25:21)
- And I shall set it as a thing destroyed. It will not be pruned, nor will it be hoed. And it must come up with the thornbush and weeds, and upon the clouds I shall lay a command to keep from precipitating any rain upon it. (Isaiah 5:6)
- And it must occur in that day that Tyre must be forgotten seventy years, the same as the days of one king. At the end of seventy years it will happen to Tyre as in the song of a prostitute. (Isaiah 23:15)
- And I will make Jerusalem piles of stones, the lair of jackals, and the cities of Judah I shall make a desolate waste, without an inhabitant. (Jeremiah 9:11)
- This is what Yehowah the God of Israel has said; Like these good figs, so I shall regard the exiles of Judah, whom I will send away

from this place to the land of the Chaldeans, in a good way. (Jeremiah 24:5)

- And all the nations must serve even him and his son and his grandson until the time even of his own land comes, and many nations and great kings must exploit him as a servant. (Jeremiah 27:7)
- Finally Yehowah was no longer able to put up with it because of the badness of YOUR dealings, because of the detestable things that YOU had done, and SO YOUR land came to be a devastated place and an object of astonishment and a malediction, without an inhabitant, as at this day. (Jeremiah 44:22)
- And I will make the land a desolate waste, for the reason that they have acted unfaithfully, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah. (Ezekiel 15:8)
- And they will have to know that I am Yehowah when I make the land a desolate waste, even a desolation, on account of all their detestable things that they have done. (Ezekiel 33:29)
- And the land must become a desolate waste on account of its inhabitants, because of the fruit of their dealings. (Micah 7:13)
- But it was the tent of Moloch and the star of the god Rephan that YOU took up, the figures which YOU made to worship them.

  Consequently I will deport YOU beyond Babylon. (Acts of Apostles 7:43)
