- This is what **Yehowah** has said; The one continuing to **dwell** in this city is the one that **will** die by the sword, by the famine and by the pestilence. - And Gedaliah the son of Ahikam the son of Shaphan proceeded to swear to them and to their men, saying; Do not be afraid of serving the Chaldeans. Continue dwelling in the land and **serve** the **king of Babylon**, and it **will** go well with **you**. (**Jeremiah 40:9**)
- 'If **you will** without fail keep dwelling in this land, I **will** also build **you** up and I shall not tear **you** down, and I **will** plant **you** and I shall not uproot **you**, for I shall **certainly** feel regret over the calamity that I have caused to **you**. (**Jeremiah 42:10**)
