Jeremiah 28:1" Then it came about in that year, in the beginning of the kingdom of Zedekiah<sup>1</sup> the king of Judah, in the fourth year, in the fifth month, that Hananiah the son of Azzur, the prophet who was from Gibeon, said to me in the house of Yehowah before the eyes of the priests and of all the people.

- Further, the king of Babylon made Mattaniah his uncle king in place of him. Then he changed his name to Zedekiah. (2 Kings 24:17)
- And at the return of the year King Nebuchadnezzar sent and proceeded to bring him to Babylon with desirable articles of the house of Yehowah. Further, he made Zedekiah his father's brother king over Judah and Jerusalem. (2 Chronicles 36:10)
- And Hananiah went on to say before the eyes of all the people; This is what Yehowah has said; Just like this I shall break the yoke of Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon within two full years more from off the neck of all the nations. And Jeremiah the prophet proceeded to go his way. (Jeremiah 28:11)
- There proved to be no city that made peace with the sons of Israel but the Hivites inhabiting Gibeon. All the others they took by war. (Joshua 11:19)
- So the king called the Gibeonites and talked to them.
  Incidentally, the Gibeonites were not of the sons of Israel, but of the remainder of the Amorites, and the sons of Israel themselves had sworn to them, but Saul sought to strike them down in his feeling jealous for the sons of Israel and Judah. (2 Samuel 21:2)
- And Jeremiah the prophet went on to say to Hananiah the prophet; Listen, please, O Hananiah! Yehowah has not sent you, but you yourself have caused this people to trust in a falsehood. (Jeremiah 28:15)
- For this is what Yehowah has said to the king sitting on the throne of David and to all the people dwelling in this city, YOUR brothers that have not gone forth with YOU into exile. (Jeremiah 29:16)
