

Jeremiah 34:11 But they turned about after that and began to bring back the menservants and the maidservants whom they had let go free, and they went subjecting them as menservants and as maidservants.

[6] - References:

- What shall I do to you, O Ephraim? What shall I do to you, O Judah, when the loving-kindness of **you** people is like the morning clouds and like the dew that early goes away? (**Hosea 6:4**)
- For they are my slaves whom I brought out of the land of Egypt. They must not sell themselves the way a slave is sold. (**Leviticus 25:42**)
- The words of his mouth are hurtfulness and deception, he has ceased to have insight for doing good. (**Psalms 36:3**)
- When Pharaoh got to see that relief had taken place, he made his heart unresponsive, and he did not listen to them, just as Yehowah had spoken. (**Exodus 8:15**)
- Then **you** turn **back** and profane my name and **bring back** each one his manservant and each one his maidservant, whom **you** let **go free** agreeably to their soul, and **you** subject them to become **YOUR menservants** and maidservants. (**Jeremiah 34:16**)
- And I will pay **back** to Babylon and to all the inhabitants of Chaldea all their badness that they have committed in Zion before the eyes of **you** people, is the utterance of Yehowah. (**Jeremiah 51:24**)
