

**Jeremiah 36:3** Perhaps those of the house of Judah will listen to all the calamity that I am thinking of doing to them, to the end that they may return, each one from his bad way, and that I may actually forgive their error and their sin.

[8] - References:

- Perhaps they **will listen** and **return**, each one from his **bad way**, and I shall have to feel regret for the **calamity** that I **am thinking** to execute upon them because of the badness of their dealings. (**Jeremiah 26:3**)
- Let the wicked man leave his **way**, and the harmful man his thoughts, and let him **return** to Yehowah, who **will** have mercy upon him, and to our God, for he **will forgive** in a large **way**. (**Isaiah 55:7**)
- And that nation **actually** turns back from its badness against which I spoke, I **will** also feel regret over the **calamity** that I had thought to execute upon it. (**Jeremiah 18:8**)
- Say to them; As I **am** alive, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah, I take delight, not in the death of the wicked one, but in that someone wicked turns back from his **way** and **actually** keeps living. Turn back, turn back from **your bad ways**, for why is it that **you** should die, O **house** of Israel? (**Ezekiel 33:11**)
- And let them cover themselves with sackcloth, man and domestic animal, and let them call out to God with strength and come back, each one from his **bad way** and from the violence that was in their hands. (**Jonah 3:8**)
- Who is a God like you, one pardoning **error** and passing over transgression of the remnant of his inheritance? He **will** certainly not hold onto his anger forever, for he is delighting in loving-kindness. (**Micah 7:18**)
- For there is the true forgiveness with you, in order that you may be feared. (**Psalms 130:4**)
- And now make **your ways** and **your** dealings good, and obey the voice of Yehowah **your** God, and Yehowah **will** feel regret for the **calamity** that he has spoken against **you**. (**Jeremiah 26:13**)
