

**Jeremiah 38:4** And the princes began to say to the king; Let this man,<sup>1</sup> please, be put to death, for that is how he is weakening the hands of the men of war who are left remaining in this city and the hands of all the people, by speaking to them according to these words. For this man is one seeking not for the peace of this people but for calamity.

- And the priests and the prophets **began** to **say** to the princes and to all the **people**; To this **man** the judgment of **death** belongs, because he has prophesied concerning this **city** just as **you** have heard with **your** own ears. (**Jeremiah 26:11**)
- And Amaziah the priest of Bethel proceeded to send to Jeroboam the **king** of Israel, saying; Amos has conspired against you right inside the house of Israel. The land is not able to **put** up with all his **words**. (**Amos 7:10**)
- At this the **king** of Egypt said to them; Why is it, Moses and Aaron, that **you** cause the **people** to leave off from their works? Go bearing **your** burdens! (**Exodus 5:4**)
- To that the **king** of Israel said to Jehoshaphat; There is still one **man** through whom to inquire of Yehowah, but I myself certainly hate him, for he does not prophesy good things concerning me but bad, Micaiah the son of Imlah. However, Jehoshaphat said; Do not let the **king say** a thing like that. (**1 Kings 22:8**)
- And he went on to **say**; So may God do to me, and so may he add to it, if the head of Elisha the son of Shaphat continues standing upon him today! (**2 Kings 6:31**)
- At that the **king** of Israel said to Jehoshaphat; There is still one **man** through whom to inquire of Yehowah, but I myself certainly hate him, for he is prophesying concerning me, not for good, but, all his days, for bad. He is Micaiah the son of Imlah. However, Jehoshaphat said; Do not let the **king say** a thing like that. (**2 Chronicles 18:7**)
- For all of them were trying to make us afraid, saying; Their **hands** will drop down from the work so that it will not be done. But now strengthen my **hands**. (**Nehemiah 6:9**)

- In time the princes of Judah got to hear these **words**, and they proceeded to come up from the house of the **king** to the house of Yehowah and to sit down in the entrance of the new gate of Yehowah. (**Jeremiah 26:10**)
- And the princes **began** to get indignant at Jeremiah, and they struck him and **put** him into the house of fetters, in the house of Jehonathan the secretary, for this was what they had made the house of detention. (**Jeremiah 37:15**)
- And in case the princes hear that I have spoken with you and they actually come in to you and **say** to you; Do tell us, **please**, What did you speak about to the **king**? Do not hide anything from us, and we shall not **put** you to **death**. And what did the **king** speak about to you? (**Jeremiah 38:25**)
- But Baruch the son of Neriah is instigating you against us for the purpose of giving us into the hand of the Chaldeans, to **put** us to **death** or to take us into exile in Babylon. (**Jeremiah 43:3**)
- The lips of those rising up against me and their whispering against me all day long. (**Lamentations 3:62**)
