Jeremiah 3:20. Truly as a wife¹ has treacherously gone from her companion, so you, O house of Israel, have dealt treacherously with me, is the utterance of Yehowah.

- And Yehowah went on to say to me; Go once again, love a woman loved by a companion and committing adultery, as in the case of Yehowah's love for the sons of Israel while they are turning to other gods and are loving raisin cakes. (Hosea 3:1)
- Moreover, you have not heard, neither have you known, nor from that time on has your ear been opened. For I well know that without fail you kept dealing treacherously, and a transgressor from the belly you have been called. (Isaiah 48:8)
- For the house of Israel and the house of Judah have positively dealt treacherously with me, is the utterance of Yehowah. (Jeremiah 5:11)
- With Yehowah himself they have dealt treacherously, for it is to strange sons that they have become father. Now a month will devour them with their portions. (Hosea 5:7)
