

**Jeremiah 41:9<sup>••</sup>** Now the cistern into which Ishmael threw all the carcasses of the men that he had struck down was a great cistern,<sup>1</sup> the one that King Asa had made because of Baasha the king of Israel. It was the one that Ishmael the son of Nethaniah<sup>2</sup> filled with those slain.

- When all the chiefs of the military forces, they and their **men**, heard that the **king** of Babylon had appointed Gedaliah, they immediately came to Gedaliah at Mizpah, that is, **Ishmael** the **son** of **Nethaniah** and Johanan the **son** of Kareah and Seraiah the **son** of Tanhumeth the Netophathite and Jaazaniah the **son** of the Maacathite, they and their **men**. (**2 Kings 25:23**)
- So they came to Gedaliah at Mizpah, even **Ishmael** the **son** of **Nethaniah** and Johanan and Jonathan, the **sons** of Kareah, and Seraiah the **son** of Tanhumeth and the **sons** of Ephai the Netophathite and Jezaniah the **son** of the Maacathite, they and their **men**. (**Jeremiah 40:8**)
- And **King Asa**, for his part, summoned all Judah, there was none exempt, and they proceeded to carry the stones of Ramah and the timbers of it, with which **Baasha** had been building, and **King Asa** began to build with them Geba in Benjamin, and Mizpah. (**1 Kings 15:22**)
- As for **Asa** the **king**, he took all Judah, and they proceeded to carry away the stones of Ramah and its timbers with which **Baasha** had built, and he began to build with them Geba and Mizpah. (**2 Chronicles 16:6**)
