

Jeremiah 42:10 **“ If you will without fail keep dwelling in this land, I will also build you up and I shall not tear you down, and I will plant you and I shall not uproot you, for I shall certainly feel regret over the calamity that I have caused to you.**

[9] - References:

- Trust in Yehowah and do good; Reside in the earth, and deal with faithfulness. (**Psalms 37:3**)
- And I **will** set my eye upon them in a good way, and I shall **certainly** cause them to return to this **land**. And I **will build** them up, and I shall not **tear down**, and I **will plant** them, and I shall not **uproot**. (**Jeremiah 24:6**)
- And it must occur that just as I had kept alert toward them to **uproot** and to pull **down** and to **tear down** and to destroy and to do damage, so I shall **keep** alert toward them to **build** up and to plant, is the utterance of Yehowah. (**Jeremiah 31:28**)
- And I **will** bring back the captives of Judah and the captives of Israel, and I **will build** them just as at the start. (**Jeremiah 33:7**)
- For Yehowah **will** judge his people and he **will feel regret** over his servants, because he **will** see that support has disappeared and there is only a helpless and worthless one. (**Deuteronomy 32:36**)
- And that nation actually turns back from its badness against which I spoke, I **will** also **feel regret** over the **calamity** that I had thought to execute upon it. (**Jeremiah 18:8**)
- Did Hezekiah the king of Judah and all those of Judah by any means put him to death? Did he not fear Yehowah and proceed to soften the face of Yehowah, so that Yehowah got to feeling **regret** for the **calamity** that he had spoken against them? So we are working up a great **calamity** against our souls. (**Jeremiah 26:19**)
- Who is a God like you, one pardoning error and passing over transgression of the remnant of his inheritance? He **will certainly** not hold onto his anger forever, for he is delighting in loving-kindness. (**Micah 7:18**)
- And as for the nation that **will** bring its neck under the yoke of the king of Babylon and actually serve him, I **will** also let it rest

upon its ground, is the utterance of Yehowah, and it **will certainly cultivate it and dwell in it. (Jeremiah 27:11)**
