

Jeremiah 46:19 **Make for yourself mere baggage for exile, O inhabitress, the daughter of Egypt. For Noph itself will become a mere object of astonishment and will actually be set afire, so as to be without an inhabitant.**

- As for you, O son of man, make up for yourself luggage for **exile** and go into **exile** in the daytime before their eyes, and you must go into **exile** from your place to another place before their eyes. Perhaps they **will** see, though they are a rebellious house. (**Ezekiel 12:3**)
- Get down from glory, and sit down in thirst, O **inhabitress** of the **daughter** of Dibon, for the despoiler of Moab has come up against you. He **will actually** bring your fortified places to ruin. (**Jeremiah 48:18**)
- The word that occurred to Jeremiah for all the Jews that were dwelling in the land of **Egypt**, the ones dwelling in Migdol and in Tahpanhes and in **Noph** and in the land of Pathros, saying; (**Jeremiah 44:1**)
- When I make the land of **Egypt** a desolate waste and the land is desolated of its fullness, when I strike down all the **inhabitants** in it, they **will** also have to know that I am Yehowah. (**Ezekiel 32:15**)
- Woe to those inhabiting the region of the sea, the nation of Cherethites! The word of Yehowah is against **you** people. O Canaan, the land of the Philistines, I **will** also destroy you, so that there **will** be no **inhabitant**. (**Zephaniah 2:5**)
- Even the sons of **Noph** and Tahpanes themselves kept feeding on you at the crown of the head. (**Jeremiah 2:16**)
- And I **will** make the land of **Egypt** a desolate waste in the midst of desolated lands, and its own cities **will become** a desolate waste in the very midst of devastated cities for forty years, and I **will** scatter the Egyptians among the nations and disperse them among the lands. (**Ezekiel 29:12**)
- They must also be made desolate in the midst of desolated lands, and its own cities **will** come to be right in the midst of devastated cities. (**Ezekiel 30:7**)
