- **Pharaoh** the **king** of **Egypt** and his servants and his princes and all his people. (**Jeremiah 25:19**)
- Son of man, set your face against **Pharaoh** the **king** of **Egypt** and prophesy against him and against **Egypt** in its entirety. (**Ezekiel 29:2**)
- Son of man, lift up a dirge concerning **Pharaoh** the **king** of **Egypt**, and you must say to him; As a maned young lion of nations you have been silenced. And you have been like the marine monster in the seas, and you kept gushing in your **rivers** and kept muddying the waters with your feet and fouling their rivers. (**Ezekiel 32:2**)
- In his days **Pharaoh** Nechoh the **king** of **Egypt** came up to the **king** of Assyria by the **river Euphrates**, and King **Josiah** proceeded to go to meet him, but he put him to death at Megiddo as soon as he saw him. (**2 Kings 23:29**)
- After all this when **Josiah** had prepared the house, **Necho** the **king** of **Egypt** came up to fight at **Carchemish** by the **Euphrates**. Then **Josiah** went out to an encounter with him. (**2 Chronicles 35:20**)
- Is not Calno just like **Carchemish**? Is not Hamath just like Arpad? Is not Samaria just like Damascus? (**Isaiah 10:9**)
- Twenty-five **years** old was **Jehoiakim** when he began to reign, and for eleven **years** he reigned in Jerusalem. And his mother's name was Zebidah the daughter of Pedaiiah from Rumah. (**2 Kings 23:36**)
- Twenty-five **years** old was **Jehoiakim** when he began to reign, and for eleven **years** he reigned in Jerusalem, and he continued

to do what was bad in the eyes of Yehowah his God. (2 Chronicles 36:5)

- The word that occurred to Jeremiah concerning all the people of **Judah** in the **fourth year** of **Jehoiakim** the **son** of **Josiah**, the **king** of **Judah**, that is, the first **year** of **Nebuchadrezzar** the **king** of **Babylon**. (Jeremiah 25:1)
- Now it came about in the **fourth year** of **Jehoiakim** the **son** of **Josiah**, the **king** of **Judah**, that this word occurred to Jeremiah from Yehowah, saying; (Jeremiah 36:1)
- In his days **Nebuchadnezzar** the **king** of **Babylon** came up, and so **Jehoiakim** became his servant for three **years**. However, he turned back and rebelled against him. (2 Kings 24:1)
- And never again did the **king** of **Egypt** come out from his land, for the **king** of **Babylon** had taken all that **happened** to belong to the **king** of **Egypt** from the torrent valley of **Egypt** up to the **river Euphrates**. (2 Kings 24:7)
- And **Josiah** did not turn his face away from him, but to fight against him he disguised himself and did not listen to the words of **Necho** from the mouth of God. So he came to fight in the valley plain of Megiddo. (2 Chronicles 35:22)
- Furthermore, the **king** of **Egypt** made **Eliakim** his brother **king** over **Judah** and Jerusalem and changed his name to **Jehoiakim**, but his brother **Jehoahaz**, **Necho** took and brought to **Egypt**. (2 Chronicles 36:4)
- And I will deliver up **Egypt** into the hand of a hard master, and strong will be the **king** that will rule over them, is the utterance of the true Lord, Yehowah of armies. (Isaiah 19:4)
- And he must come in and strike the land of **Egypt**. Whoever is due for deadly plague will be for deadly plague, and whoever is due for captivity will be for captivity, and whoever is due for the sword will be for the sword. (Jeremiah 43:11)
- Son of man, say to **Pharaoh** the **king** of **Egypt** and to his crowd; Whom have you come to resemble in your greatness? (Ezekiel 31:2)
- For here I am raising up the Chaldeans, the nation bitter and impetuous, which is going to the wide-open places of earth in

order to take possession of residences not belonging to it.
(**Habakkuk 1:6**)
