

Jeremiah 47:3 At the sound of the stamping of the hoofs of his stallions, at the rattling of his war chariots, the turmoil of his wheels, the fathers will actually not turn around to the sons, because of the dropping down of their hands.

[9] - References:

- It was then that the **hoofs** of horses pawed because of dashings upon dashings of his **stallions**. (**Judges 5:22**)
- The horse is something prepared for the day of battle, but salvation belongs to Yehowah. (**Proverbs 21:31**)
- From Dan has been heard the snorting of his horses. Due to the sound of the neighing of his **stallions** the whole land has begun to rock. And they come in and eat up the land and what fills it, the city and its inhabitants. (**Jeremiah 8:16**)
- In the streets the **war chariots** keep driving madly. They keep rushing up and **down** in the public squares. Their appearances are like torches. Like the lightnings they keep running. (**Nahum 2:4**)
- Owing to the heaving mass of his horses their dust **will** cover you. Owing to the sound of cavalryman and wheel and **war** chariot your walls **will** rock, when he comes in through your gates, as in the cases of entering into a city opened by breaches. (**Ezekiel 26:10**)
- There is the sound of the whip and the sound of the **rattling** of the wheel, and the dashing horse and the leaping chariot. (**Nahum 3:2**)
- It paws in the low plain and exults in power, it goes forth to meet armor. (**Job 39:21**)
- Bow and javelin they handle. They are cruel and **will** show no mercy. The sound of them is like the sea that is boisterous, and upon horses they **will** ride, set in array as one man for **war** against you, O daughter of Babylon. (**Jeremiah 50:42**)
- And they must come in against you with **rattling** of **war chariots** and **wheels**, and with a congregation of peoples, with large shield and buckler and helmet. They **will** set themselves against you all

around, and I **will** give judgment over to them, and they must judge you with their judgments. (**Ezekiel 23:24**)
