Jeremiah 50:38" There is a devastation upon her waters, and they must be dried up. For it is a land of graven images, and because of their frightful visions they keep acting crazy.

- The One saying to the watery deep, Be evaporated, and all your rivers I shall dry up. (Isaiah 44:27)
- Therefore this is what Yehowah has said; Here I am conducting your legal case, and I shall certainly execute vengeance for you. And I will dry up her sea, and I will make her wells dry. (Jeremiah 51:36)
- And the sixth one poured out his bowl upon the great river Euphrates, and its water was dried up, that the way might be prepared for the kings from the rising of the sun. (Revelation 16:12)
- Bel has bent down, Nebo is stooping over, their idols have come to be for the wild beasts and for the domestic animals, their loads, pieces of luggage, a burden for the tired animals. (Isaiah 46:1)
- Therefore, look! There are days coming, is the utterance of Yehowah, and I will turn my attention upon her graven images, and throughout all her land the pierced one will groan. (Jeremiah 51:52)
- They drank wine, and they praised the gods of gold and of silver, copper, iron, wood and stone. (Daniel 5:4)
- The places from which rivers trickled he has dammed up, and the concealed thing he brings forth to the light. (Job 28:11)
- By the rivers of Babylon, there we sat down. We also wept when we remembered Zion. (Psalms 137:1)
- Babylon has been a golden cup in the hand of Yehowah, she making all the earth drunk. From her wine the nations have drunk. That is why the nations keep acting crazed. (Jeremiah 51:7)
- The mighty men of Babylon have ceased to fight. They have kept sitting in the strong places. Their mightiness has run dry. They

- have become women. Her residences have been set on fire. Her bars have been broken. (Jeremiah 51:30)
- And that the fords themselves have been seized, and the papyrus boats they have burned with fire, and the men of war themselves have become disturbed. (Jeremiah 51:32)
- To the intent that they may be lacking bread and water and they may look astonished at one another and rot away in their error. (Ezekiel 4:17)
