Jeremiah 50:5" To Zion they will keep asking the way, with their faces in that direction, saying, Come and let us join ourselves to Yehowah in an indefinitely lasting covenant that will not be forgotten.

[9] - References:

- And the very ones redeemed by Yehowah will return and certainly come to Zion with a joyful cry, and rejoicing to time indefinite will be upon their head. To exultation and rejoicing they will attain, and grief and sighing must flee away. (Isaiah 35:10)
- Look! There are days coming, is the utterance of Yehowah, and I will conclude with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah a New Covenant. (Jeremiah 31:31)
- Afterwards the sons of Israel will come back and certainly look for Yehowah their God, and for David their king, and they will certainly come quivering to Yehowah and to his goodness in the final part of the days. (Hosea 3:5)
- Has God forgotten to be favorable, or has he shut off his mercies in anger? (Psalms 77:9)
- Instead of the thicket of thorns the juniper tree will come up.

 Instead of the stinging nettle the myrtle tree will come up. And it must become for Yehowah something famous, a sign to time indefinite that will not be cut off. (Isaiah 55:13)
- And the foreigners that have joined themselves to Yehowah to minister to him and to love the name of Yehowah, in order to become servants to him, all those keeping the Sabbath in order not to profane it and laying hold of my covenant. (Isaiah 56:6)
- For there exists a day when the lookouts in the mountainous region of Ephraim will actually call out, Rise up, O men, and let us go up to Zion, to Yehowah our God. (Jeremiah 31:6)
- And I, I myself, must remember my covenant with you in the days of your youth, and I must establish for you an indefinitely lasting covenant. (Ezekiel 16:60)
- This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said; This is what I shall yet let myself be searched for by the house of Israel to do

for them; I shall multiply them like a flock with men. (Ezekiel 36:37)
