Jeremiah 7:19... Is it I whom they are offending? Is the utterance of Yehowah. Is it not they themselves, for the purpose of shame to their faces?

[11] - References:

- They began inciting him to jealousy with strange gods, With detestable things they kept offending him. (Deuteronomy 32:16)
- And he went on to say to me; Have you seen this, O son of man? Is it such a light thing to the house of Judah to do the detestable things that they have done here, that they have to fill the land with violence and that they should offend me again, and here they are thrusting out the shoot to my nose? (Ezekiel 8:17)
- Or are we inciting Yehowah to jealousy? We are not stronger than he is, are we? (1 Corinthians 10:22)
- They will certainly be ashamed and even be humiliated, all of them. Together in humiliation the manufacturers of idol forms will have to walk. (Isaiah 45:16)
- But Yehowah was with me like a terrible mighty one. That is why the very ones persecuting me will stumble and not prevail. They will certainly be put to much shame, because they will not have prospered. Their indefinitely lasting humiliation will be one that will not be forgotten. (Jeremiah 20:11)
- To you, O Yehowah, there belongs the righteousness, but to us the shame of face as at this day, to the men of Judah and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem and to all those of Israel, those nearby and those far away in all the lands to which you dispersed them because of their unfaithfulness with which they acted against you. (Daniel 9:7)
- On account of the sins of Jeroboam with which he sinned and with which he caused Israel to sin and by his offensiveness with which he offended Yehowah the God of Israel. (1 Kings 15:30)
- If you actually sin, what do you accomplish against him? And if your revolts actually increase, what do you do to him? (Job 35:6)
- Woe to the sinful nation, the people heavy with error, an evildoing seed, ruinous sons! They have left Yehowah, they have

- treated the Holy One of Israel with disrespect, they have turned backwards. (Isaiah 1:4)
- But you did not listen to me, is the utterance of Yehowah, to the intent that you might offend me with the work of your hands, for calamity to yourselves. (Jeremiah 25:7)
- And now this is what Yehowah, the God of armies, the God of Israel, has said; Why are you causing a great calamity to your souls, in order to cut off from yourselves man and woman, child and suckling, out of the midst of Judah, so that you do not leave over for yourselves a remnant. (Jeremiah 44:7)
