even to say; Enter in between the wheelwork, in under the cherubs, and fill the hollows of both your hands with coals of fire from between the cherubs and toss them over the city. So he entered in before my eyes.

- Jeremiah now said to Zedekiah; This is what Yehowah, the God of armies, the God of Israel, has said, If you will without fail go out to the princes of the king of Babylon, your soul will also certainly keep living and this city itself will not be burned with fire, and you yourself and your household will certainly keep living. (Jeremiah 38:17)
- And all your wives and your sons they are bringing out to the Chaldeans, and you yourself will not escape out of their hand, but by the hand of the king of Babylon you will be seized, and because of you this city will be burned with fire. (Jeremiah 38:23)
- And, look! There were six men coming from the direction of the upper gate that faces to the north, each one with his weapon for smashing in his hand, and there was one man in among them clothed with linen, with a secretary's inkhorn at his hips, and they proceeded to come in and stand beside the copper altar. (Ezekiel 9:2)
- And as for the likeness of the living creatures, their appearance was like burning coals of fire. Something like the appearance of torches was moving back and forth between the living creatures, and the fire was bright, and out of the fire there was lightning going forth. (Ezekiel 1:13)
- As for the appearance of the wheels and their structure, it was like the glow of chrysolite, and the four of them had one likeness. And their appearance and their structure were just as when a wheel proved to be in the midst of a wheel. (Ezekiel 1:16)
- And he proceeded to burn the house of Yehowah and the king's house and all the houses of Jerusalem, and the house of every great man he burned with fire. (2 Kings 25:9)

- Sharpened arrows of a mighty man, along with burning coals of the broom trees. (Psalms 120:4)
- May burning coals be dropped upon them. Let them be made to fall into the fire, into watery pits, that they may not get up. (Psalms 140:10)
- But right away the angel took the incense vessel, and he filled it with some of the fire of the altar and hurled it to the earth. And thunders occurred and voices and lightnings and an earthquake. (Revelation 8:5)
- At that, one of the seraphs flew to me, and in his hand there was a glowing coal that he had taken with tongs off the altar. (Isaiah 6:6)
- And the cherubs now lifted up their wings, and the wheels were close by them, and the glory of the God of Israel was over them, from above. (Ezekiel 11:22)
