be caught in my hunting net, and I will bring him to Babylon, to the land of the Chaldeans, but it he will not see, and there he will die.

- And the eyes of Zedekiah he blinded, after which the king of Babylon bound him with copper fetters and brought him to Babylon and put him in the house of custody until the day of his death. (Jeremiah 52:11)
- Bring forth a people blind though eyes themselves exist, and the ones deaf though they have ears. (Isaiah 43:8)
- All you wild animals of the open field, come to eat, all you wild animals in the forest. (Isaiah 56:9)
- His watchmen are blind. None of them have taken note. All of them are speechless dogs, they are not able to bark, panting, lying down, loving to slumber. (Isaiah 56:10)

- They are even dogs strong in soulful desire, they have known no satisfaction. They are also shepherds that have not known how to understand. They have all of them turned to their own way, each one for his unjust gain from his own border. (Isaiah 56:11)
- Come, men! Let me take some wine, and let us drink intoxicating liquor to the limit. And tomorrow will certainly turn out just as today, great in a very much larger way. (Isaiah 56:12)
- KNOW, then, that God himself has misled me, and his hunting net he has closed in upon me. (Job 19:6)
- You have brought us into a hunting net, you have put pressure on our hips. (Psalms 66:11)
- Then they seized the king and brought him up to the king of Babylon at Riblah in the land of Hamath, that he might pronounce upon him judicial decisions. (Jeremiah 52:9)
- From the height he has sent fire into my bones, and he subdues each one. He has spread out a net for my feet. He has turned me backward. He has made me a woman laid desolate. All the day I am ill. (Lamentations 1:13)

- As a snare. For it will come in upon all those dwelling upon the face of all the earth. (Luke 21:35)
- This is what Yehowah the God of Israel has said, Like these good figs, so I shall regard the exiles of Judah, whom I will send away from this place to the land of the Chaldeans, in a good way.
