

Ezekiel 12:4

And you must bring out your luggage like luggage for exile in the daytime before their eyes, and you yourself will go out in the evening before their eyes like those being brought forth for exile.

[8] - References:

- When my enemies turn back, they **will** stumble and perish from **before** you. (**Psalms 9:3**)
- For he has neither despised nor loathed the affliction of the afflicted one, and he has not concealed his face from him, and when he cried to him for help he heard. (**Psalms 22:24**)
- But I am afflicted and poor. Yehowah himself takes account of me. You are my assistance and the Provider of escape for me. O my God, do not be too late. (**Psalms 40:17**)
- Incline, O Yehowah, your ear. Answer me, for I am afflicted and poor. (**Psalms 86:1**)
- For you are great and are doing wondrous things, you are God, you alone. (**Psalms 86:10**)
- Instruct me, O Yehowah, about your way. I shall walk in your truth. Unify my heart to fear your name. (**Psalms 86:11**)
- I laud you, O Yehowah my God, with all my heart, and I **will** glorify your name to time indefinite. (**Psalms 86:12**)
- O God, the presumptuous ones themselves have risen up against me, and the very assembly of tyrannical ones have looked for my soul, and they have not set you in front of themselves. (**Psalms 86:14**)
- Work **out** with me a sign meaning goodness, that those hating me may see it and be ashamed. For you yourself, O Yehowah, have helped me and comforted me. (**Psalms 86:17**)
- Furthermore, he carried off those remaining from the sword captive to Babylon, and they came to be servants to him and his sons until the royalty of Persia began to reign. (**2 Chronicles 36:20**)

- And the **eyes** of Zedekiah he blinded, after which the king of Babylon bound him with copper fetters and **brought** him to Babylon and put him in the house of custody until the day of his death. (**Jeremiah 52:11**)
