Ezekiel 16:32. In the case of the wife that commits adultery, she takes strangers instead of her own husband.

- Therefore, O Oholibah, this is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said, Here I am rousing up your passionate lovers against you, those from whom your soul has turned away in disgust, and I will bring them in against you on all sides. (Ezekiel 23:22)
- For their mother has committed fornication. She that was pregnant with them has acted shamefully, for she has said, I want to go after those passionately loving me, those giving my bread and my water, my wool and my linen, my oil and my drink. (Hosea 2:5)
- And she will actually chase after her passionate lovers, but she will not overtake them, and she will certainly look for them, but she will not find them. And she will have to say, I want to go and return to my husband, the first one, for I had it better at that time than now. (Hosea 2:7)
- And now I shall uncover her private parts to the eyes of her passionate lovers, and there will be no man to snatch her out of my hand. (Hosea 2:10)
- And I will hold an accounting against her for the days of the Baal images to which she kept making sacrificial smoke, when she kept decking herself with her ring and her ornament and kept going after her passionate lovers, and I was the one that she forgot, is the utterance of Yehowah. (Hosea 2:13)
- Hold your foot back from becoming barefoot, and your throat from thirst. But you proceeded to say, It is hopeless! No, but I have fallen in love with strangers, and after them I am going to walk. (Jeremiah 2:25)
- There is a saying; If a man should send away his wife and she should actually go away from him and become another man's, should he return to her anymore? Has that land not positively been polluted? And you yourself have committed prostitution

- with many companions, and should there be a returning to me? Is the utterance of Yehowah. (Jeremiah 3:1)
- Truly as a wife has treacherously gone from her companion, so YOU, O house of Israel, have dealt treacherously with me, is the utterance of Yehowah. (Jeremiah 3:20)
- And Yehowah went on to say to me; Go once again, love a woman loved by a companion and committing adultery, as in the case of Yehowah's love for the sons of Israel while they are turning to other gods and are loving raisin cakes. (Hosea 3:1)
- For it is with adulterers that the land has become full. For because of the curse the land has gone to mourning, the pasture grounds of the wilderness have dried up, and their course of action proves to be bad, and their mightiness is not right. (Jeremiah 23:10)
