Ezekiel 16:60... And I, I myself, must remember my covenant with you in the days of your youth, and I must establish for you an indefinitely lasting covenant.

[7] - References:

- Make the heart of this people unreceptive, and make their very ears unresponsive, and paste their very eyes together, that they may not see with their eyes and with their ears they may not hear, and that their own heart may not understand and that they may not actually turn back and get healing for themselves. (Isaiah 6:10)
- And when it occurs I will let you have as a remnant the ones escaping from the sword among the nations, when you get scattered among the lands. (Ezekiel 6:8)
- And YOUR escaped ones will certainly remember me among the nations to which they will have been taken captive, because I have been broken up at their fornicating heart that has turned aside from me and at their eyes that are going in fornication after their dungy idols, and they will certainly feel a loathing in their faces at the bad things that they have done in all their detestable things. (Ezekiel 6:9)
- And they will have to know that I am Yehowah, not in vain did I speak about doing to them this calamitous thing. (Ezekiel 6:10)
- And I shall indeed remember my covenant with Jacob, and even my covenant with Isaac and even my covenant with Abraham I shall remember, and the land I shall remember. (Leviticus 26:42)
- And he would remember concerning them his covenant, and he would feel regret according to the abundance of his grand loving-kindness. (Psalms 106:45)
- And I will conclude with them an indefinitely lasting covenant, that I shall not turn back from behind them, for me to do them good, and the fear of me I shall put in their heart in order not to turn aside from me. (Jeremiah 32:40)
- To Zion they will keep asking the way, with their faces in that direction, saying, Come and let us join ourselves to Yehowah in an indefinitely lasting covenant that will not be forgotten.

 (Jeremiah 50:5)

Now it is not with you alone that I am concluding this covenant and this oath. (Deuteronomy 29:14)
