- **Look! You are wiser than Daniel. There are no secrets that have proved a match for you. (Ezekiel 28:3)**
- **Then Samson said to them; Let me, please, propound a riddle to you. If you will without fail tell it to me during the seven days of the banquet and you do solve it, I shall in that case have to give you thirty undergarments and thirty outfits of clothing. (Judges 14:12)**
- **To understand a proverb and a puzzling saying, the words of wise persons and their riddles. (Proverbs 1:6)**
- **And I proceeded to say; Alas, O Sovereign Lord Yehowah! They are saying respecting me; Is he not composing proverbial sayings? (Ezekiel 20:49)**
- **And I spoke to the prophets, and visions I myself multiplied, and by the hand of the prophets I kept making likenesses. (Hosea 12:10)**
