[5] - References:

- Now it came about in the thirtieth year, in the fourth month, on the fifth day of the month, while I was in the midst of the exiled people by the river Chebar, that the heavens were opened and I began to see visions of God. (**Ezekiel 1:1**)
- And Yehowah showed me, and, look! Two baskets of figs set before the temple of Yehowah, after Nebuchadrezzar the king of Babylon had carried into exile Jeconiah the son of Jehoiakim, the king of Judah, and the princes of Judah and the craftsmen and the builders of bulwarks, from Jerusalem that he might bring them to Babylon. (**Jeremiah 24:1**)
- And King Zedekiah the son of Josiah began to reign in place of Coniah the son of Jehoiakim, whom Nebuchadrezzar the king of Babylon made king in the **land** of Judah. (**Jeremiah 37:1**)
- Furthermore, he took one of the royal **seed** and concluded a covenant with him and brought him into an oath, and the foremost men of the **land** he took away. (**Ezekiel 17:13**)
- Further, the king of Babylon made Mattaniah his uncle king in place of him. Then he changed his name to Zedekiah. (**2 Kings 24:17**)
