Ezekiel 19:11... And they came to be for her strong rods, meant for the scepters of rulers. And its height gradually became tall up among branches, and it got to be visible because of its tallness, because of the abundance of its foliage.

- I shall see him, but not now, I shall behold him, but not near. A star will certainly step forth out of Jacob, and a scepter will indeed rise out of Israel. And he will certainly break apart the temples of Moab's head and the cranium of all the sons of tumult of war. (Numbers 24:17)
- And there proved to be strong kings over Jerusalem and governing all beyond the River, and tax, tribute and toll were being given to them. (Ezra 4:20)
