Young lion is what he became. And he gradually learned how to tear apart prey. He devoured even earthling man.

- The pronouncement against the beasts of the south! Through the land of distress and hard conditions, of the lion and the leopard growling, of the viper and the flying fiery snake, on the shoulders of full-grown asses they carry their resources, and on the humps of camels their supplies. In behalf of the people they will prove of no benefit. (Isaiah 30:6)
- And the Egyptians are mere vanity, and they will help simply for nothing. Therefore I have called this one; Rahab, they are for sitting still. (Isaiah 30:7)
- Now come, write it upon a tablet with them, and inscribe it even in a book, that it may serve for a future day, for a witness to time indefinite. (Isaiah 30:8)
- For it is a rebellious people, untruthful sons, sons who have been unwilling to hear the Law of Yehowah. (Isaiah 30:9)
- Who have said to the ones seeing, you must not see, and to the ones having visions, you must not envision for us any straighforward things. Speak to us smooth things, envision deceptive things. (Isaiah 30:10)
- Turn aside from the way, deviate from the path. Cause the Holy One of Israel to cease just on account of us. (Isaiah 30:11)
- Therefore this is what the Holy One of Israel has said; In view of YOUR rejecting of this word, and since YOU men trust in defrauding and in what is devious and YOU support yourselves on it. (Isaiah 30:12)
- Therefore for you this error will become like a broken section about to fall down, a swelling out in a highly raised wall, the breakdown of which may come suddenly, in an instant. (Isaiah 30:13)
- Twenty-five years old was Jehoiakim when he began to reign, and for eleven years he reigned in Jerusalem, and he continued

to do what was bad in the eyes of Yehowah his God. (2 Chronicles 36:5)

- Assuredly your eyes and your heart are upon nothing but upon your unjust gain, and upon the blood of the innocent one in order to shed it, and upon defrauding and upon extortion in order to carry them on. (Jeremiah 22:17)
- And also for the innocent blood that he had shed, so that he filled Jerusalem with innocent blood, and Yehowah did not consent to grant forgiveness. (2 Kings 24:4)
