Ezekiel 21:25... And as for you, O deadly wounded, wicked chieftain of Israel, whose day has come in the time of the error of the end.

- Do you not know that you people are God's temple, and that the spirit of God dwells in you? (1 Corinthians 3:16)
- If anyone destroys the temple of God, God will destroy him, for the temple of God is holy, which temple you people are. (1 Corinthians 3:17)
- And Yehowah proceeded to say to me; Do not pray in behalf of this people for any good. (Jeremiah 14:11)
- When they fast, I am not listening to their entreating cry, and when they offer up the whole burnt offering and the grain offering, I am taking no pleasure in them, for by the sword and by famine and by pestilence I am bringing them to their end. (Jeremiah 14:12)
- At this I said; Alas, O Sovereign Lord Yehowah! Here the prophets are saying to them; You will see no sword, and there will be no famine to happen to You, but true peace is what I shall give You in this place. (Jeremiah 14:13)
- And Yehowah went on to say to me; Falsehood is what the prophets are prophesying in my name. I have not sent them, nor have I commanded them or spoken to them. A false vision and divination and a valueless thing and the trickiness of their heart they are speaking prophetically to you people. (Jeremiah 14:14)
- Therefore this is what Yehowah has said concerning the prophets who are prophesying in my name and whom I myself did not send and who are saying that no sword or famine will occur in this land, By sword and by famine those prophets will come to their finish. (Jeremiah 14:15)
- And the very people to whom they are prophesying will become people cast out into the streets of Jerusalem because of the famine and the sword, with no one to do the burying of them, them, their wives and their sons and their daughters. And I will pour out upon them their calamity. (Jeremiah 14:16)

- But I shall not take the entire kingdom out of his hand, because a chieftain I shall set him for all the days of his life, for the sake of David my servant whom I chose, because he kept my commandments and my statutes. (1 Kings 11:34)
- And even against King Nebuchadnezzar he rebelled, who had made him swear by God, and he kept stiffening his neck and hardening his heart so as not to return to Yehowah the God of Israel. (2 Chronicles 36:13)
- And like the bad figs that cannot be eaten for badness, this in fact is what Yehowah has said; So I shall give Zedekiah the king of Judah and his princes and the remnant of Jerusalem who are remaining over in this land and those who are dwelling in the land of Egypt. (Jeremiah 24:8)
- And he continued to do what was bad in the eyes of Yehowah, according to all that Jehoiakim had done. (Jeremiah 52:2)
- Therefore this is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said; As I am alive, surely my oath that he has despised and my covenant that he has broken, I will even bring it upon his head. (Ezekiel 17:19)
- An end itself must come. The end must come, it must awaken for you. Look! It is coming. (Ezekiel 7:6)
- And he continued to do what was bad in Yehowah's eyes, according to all that Jehoiakim had done. (2 Kings 24:19)
- Yehowah himself will laugh at him, for he certainly sees that his day will come. (Psalms 37:13)
- You have shortened the days of his youth, you have enwrapped him with shame. (Psalms 89:45)
- Say to them; This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said; As regards the chieftain, there is this pronouncement against Jerusalem and all the house of Israel who are in the midst of them. (Ezekiel 12:10)
