- However, the inspired utterance says definitely that in later periods of time some **will** fall away from the faith, paying attention to misleading inspired utterances and teachings of demons. (**1 Timothy 4:1**)
- By the hypocrisy of **men** who speak lies, marked in their conscience as with a branding iron. (**1 Timothy 4:2**)
- Forbidding to marry, commanding to abstain from foods which God created to be partaken of with thanksgiving by those who have faith and accurately know the truth. (**1 Timothy 4:3**)
- The reason for this is that every creation of God is fine, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving. (**1 Timothy 4:4**)
- For it is sanctified through God's word and prayer over it. (**1 Timothy 4:5**)
- I solemnly charge you before God and Christ Jesus, who is destined to judge the living and the dead, and by his manifestation and his kingdom. (**2 Timothy 4:1**)
- Preach the word, be at it urgently in favorable season, in troublesome season, reprove, reprimand, exhort, with all long-suffering and art of teaching. (**2 Timothy 4:2**)
- For there **will** be a period of time when they **will** not put up with the healthful teaching, but, in accord with their own desires, they **will** accumulate teachers for themselves to have their ears tickled. (**2 Timothy 4:3**)
- And they **will** turn their ears away from the truth, whereas they **will** be turned aside to false stories. (**2 Timothy 4:4**)
- You, though, keep your senses in all things, suffer evil, do the work of an evangelizer, fully accomplish your ministry. (**2 Timothy 4:5**)

- **My soul is in the middle of lions; I cannot but lie down among devourers, even the sons of **men**, whose teeth are spears and arrows, and whose tongue is a sharp sword. (**Psalms 57:4**)**
- **The roaring of theirs is like that of a lion, and they roar like maned young lions. And they **will** growl and grab hold of the prey and bring it safely away, and there **will** be no deliverer. (**Isaiah 5:29**)**
- **And they **will** growl over it in that day as with the growling of the sea. And one **will** actually gaze at the land, and, look! There is distressing darkness, and even the light has grown dark because of the drops falling on it. (**Isaiah 5:30**)**
- **Israel is a scattered sheep. Lions themselves have done the dispersing. In the first instance the king of Assyria has devoured him, and in this latter instance Nebuchadrezzar the king of Babylon has gnawed on his bones. (**Jeremiah 50:17**)**
- **Her princes in the midst of her were roaring lions. Her judges were evening wolves that did not gnaw bones till the morning. (**Zephaniah 3:3**)**
- **Listen! The howling of shepherds, for their majesty has been despoiled. Listen! The roaring of maned young lions, for the proud thickets along the Jordan have been despoiled. (**Zechariah 11:3**)**
- **A wind **will** shepherd all your own shepherds, and as for those intensely loving you, they **will** go into captivity itself. For at that time you **will** be ashamed and certainly feel humiliated because of all your calamity. (**Jeremiah 22:22**)**
- **Howl, O Heshbon, for Ai has been despoiled! Cry **out**, O dependent towns of Rabbah. Gird sackcloth on yourselves. Wail, and rove about among the stone pens, for Malcam himself **will** go even into exile, his priests and his princes, all together. (**Jeremiah 49:3**)**
- **He has gone up as a lion **out** of his thicket, and the one who is bringing the nations to ruin has pulled away, he has gone forth from his place in order to render your land as an object of astonishment. Your own cities **will** fall in ruins so that there **will** be no inhabitant. (**Jeremiah 4:7**)**

- And I **will** make Rabbah a pasture ground of camels and the sons of Ammon a resting-place of a flock, and **you** people **will** have to know that I am Yehowah. (**Ezekiel 25:5**)
- A nation fierce in countenance, who **will** not be partial to an old man or show favor to a young man. (**Deuteronomy 28:50**)
- And I **will** bring in the worst ones of the nations, and they **will** certainly take possession of their houses, and I **will** cause the pride of the strong ones to cease, and their sanctuaries must be profaned. (**Ezekiel 7:24**)
- And you went on to prostitute yourself to the sons of Assyria because there was no satisfying of you, and you kept prostituting yourself with them and also did not get satisfaction. (**Ezekiel 16:28**)
- As in collecting silver and copper and iron and lead and tin into the midst of a furnace, in order to **blow** upon it with **fire** to cause a liquefying, so I shall collect them together in my anger and in my rage, and I **will blow** and cause **you** people to liquefy. (**Ezekiel 22:20**)
