

Ezekiel 2:8

And you, O Son of Man, hear what I am speaking to you. Do not become rebellious like the rebellious house. Open your mouth and eat what I am giving you.

[7] - References:

- Hey there, all **you** thirsty ones! Come to the water. And the ones that have no money! Come, buy and **eat**. Yes, come, buy wine and milk even without money and without price. (**Isaiah 55:1**)
- Why do **you** people keep paying out money for **what** is not bread, and why is **your** toil for **what** results in no satisfaction? Listen intently to me, and **eat what** is good, and let **your** soul find its exquisite delight in fatness itself. (**Isaiah 55:2**)
- Incline **your** ear and come to me. Listen, and **your** soul will keep alive, and I shall readily conclude with **you** people an indefinitely lasting covenant respecting the loving-kindnesses to David that are faithful. (**Isaiah 55:3**)
- Look! As a witness to the national groups I have given him, as a leader and commander to the national groups. (**Isaiah 55:4**)
- Aaron will be gathered to his people, for he will not enter into the land that I shall certainly give to the sons of Israel, on the ground that **you** men rebelled against my order respecting the waters of Meribah. (**Numbers 20:24**)
- The Sovereign Lord Yehowah himself has opened my ear, and I, for my part, was not **rebellious**. I did not turn in the opposite direction. (**Isaiah 50:5**)
- Your words were found, and I proceeded to **eat** them, and your word **becomes** to me the exultation and the rejoicing of my heart, for your name has been called upon me, O Yehowah God of armies. (**Jeremiah 15:16**)
- And I went away to the angel and told him to give me the little scroll. And he said to me; Take it and **eat** it up, and it will make your belly bitter, but in your **mouth** it will be sweet as honey. (**Revelation 10:9**)
- And he proceeded to say to me; Son of man, **what** you find, **eat**. Eat this roll, and go, speak to the **house** of Israel. (**Ezekiel 3:1**)

- **And I proceeded to speak to the people in the morning, and my wife gradually died in the evening. So I did in the morning just as I had been commanded. (Ezekiel 24:18)**
