high hill, and on all the surface of the earth my sheep were scattered, with no one making a search and with no one seeking to find.

- Most truly I say to YOU, he that does not enter into the sheepfold through the door but climbs up some other place, that one is a thief and a plunderer. (John 10:1)
- But he that enters through the door is shepherd of the sheep.
 (John 10:2)
- The doorkeeper opens to this one, and the sheep listen to his voice, and he calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. (John 10:3)
- When he has got all his own out, he goes before them, and the sheep follow him, because they know his voice. (John 10:4)
- A stranger they will by no means follow but will flee from him, because they do not know the voice of strangers. (John 10:5)
- Jesus spoke this comparison to them, but they did not know what the things meant that he was speaking to them. (John 10:6)
- Therefore Jesus said again; Most truly I say to YOU, I am the door of the sheep. (John 10:7)
- All those that have come in place of me are thieves and plunderers, but the sheep have not listened to them. (John 10:8)
- I am the door, whoever enters through me will be saved, and he will go in and out and find pasturage. (John 10:9)
- The thief does not come unless it is to steal and slay and destroy. I have come that they might have life and might have it in abundance. (John 10:10)
- I am the fine shepherd, the fine shepherd surrenders his soul in behalf of the sheep. (John 10:11)

- The hired man, who is no shepherd and to whom the sheep do not belong as his own, beholds the wolf coming and abandons the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. (John 10:12)
- Because he is a hired man and does not care for the sheep. (John 10:13)
- I am the fine shepherd, and I know my sheep and my sheep know me. (John 10:14)
- Just as the Father knows me and I know the Father, and I surrender my soul in behalf of the sheep. (John 10:15)
- And I have other sheep, which are not of this fold, those also I must bring, and they will listen to my voice, and they will become one flock, one shepherd. (John 10:16)
- And their escapees will certainly make their escape and become on the mountains like the doves of the valleys, all of which are moaning, each one in his own error. (Ezekiel 7:16)
- Yehowah is my Shepherd. I shall lack nothing. (Psalms 23:1)
- I have wandered like a lost sheep. O look for your servant, for I have not forgotten your own commandments. A Song of the Ascents. (Psalms 119:176)
- Like sheep we have all of us wandered about, it was each one to his own way that we have turned, and Yehowah himself has caused the error of us all to meet up with that one. (Isaiah 53:6)
- A flock of perishing creatures my people has become. Their own shepherds have caused them to wander about. On the mountains they have led them away. From mountain to hill they have gone. They have forgotten their resting-place. (Jeremiah 50:6)
- For here I am letting a shepherd rise up in the land. To the sheep being effaced he will give no attention. The young one he will not seek, and the broken sheep he will not heal. The one stationing herself he will not supply with food, and the flesh of the fat one he will eat, and the hoofs of the sheep he will tear off. (Zechariah 11:16)
