Ezekiel 36:22... Therefore say to the house of Israel; This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said; Not for your sakes am I doing it, O house of Israel, but for my holy name, which you have profaned among the nations where you have come in.

- And I drew back my hand and went acting for the sake of my own name, that it should not be profaned before the eyes of the nations, before whose eyes I had brought them out. (Ezekiel 20:22)
- Yehowah has said; Go serve each one of you his own dungy idols.

 And afterward if you are not listening to me, then my holy name you will no more profane by your gifts and by your dungy idols.

 (Ezekiel 20:39)
- And he proceeded to save them for the sake of his name, so as to make his mightiness known. (Psalms 106:8)
- Do not say in your heart when Yehowah your God pushes them away from before you this, It was for my own righteousness that Yehowah has brought me in to take possession of this land, whereas it is for the wickedness of these nations that Yehowah is driving them away from before you. (Deuteronomy 9:4)
- Then the man of the true God approached and said to the king of Israel, yes, he went on to say; This is what Yehowah has said; For the reason that the Syrians have said; Yehowah is a God of mountains, and he is not a God of low plains, I shall have to give all this great crowd into your hand, and you men will certainly know that I am Yehowah. (1 Kings 20:28)

- And I shall certainly defend this city to save it for my own sake and for the sake of David my servant. (2 Kings 19:34)
- For your name's sake, O Yehowah, you must even forgive my error, for it is considerable. (Psalms 25:11)
- To the abundance of the princely rule and to peace there will be no end, upon the throne of David and upon his kingdom in order to establish it firmly and to sustain it by means of justice and by means of righteousness, from now on and to time indefinite. The very zeal of Yehowah of armies will do this. (Isaiah 9:7)
- And I shall certainly defend this city to save it for my own sake and for the sake of David my servant. (Isaiah 37:35)
- Do not disrespect us for the sake of your name, do not despise your glorious throne. Remember, do not break your covenant with us. (Jeremiah 14:21)
- But I acted for the sake of my own name that it might not be profaned before the eyes of the nations, before whose eyes I had brought them forth. (Ezekiel 20:14)
- And you will have to know that I am Yehowah when I take action with you for the sake of my name, not according to your bad ways or according to your corrupted dealings, O house of Israel, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah. (Ezekiel 20:44)
- And you will certainly be profaned within yourself before the eyes of the nations, and you will have to know that I am Yehowah. (Ezekiel 22:16)
- Not for Your sakes am I doing this, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah, let it be known to You. Be ashamed and feel humiliation because of Your ways, O house of Israel. (Ezekiel 36:32)
