This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said to the mountains and to the hills, to the streambeds and to the valleys and to the devastated places that were laid desolate and to the abandoned cities that have come to be for plunder and for ridicule to the remaining ones of the nations that are round about.**

- And you must say; This is **what** the **Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said**; O city that is shedding blood in her midst till her time **comes**, and that **has** made dungy idols within herself in order to become unclean. (**Ezekiel 22:3**)
- By your blood that you **have** shed you **have** become guilty, and by your dungy idols that you **have** made you **have** become unclean. And you bring your days near, and you will **come** to your years. That is why I must make you an object of reproach to the **nations** and of jeering to all the lands. (**Ezekiel 22:4**)
- The lands nearby and those far away from you will jeer you, O you unclean in name, abounding in confusion. (**Ezekiel 22:5**)
- Look! The chieftains of **Israel have** proved to be in you, each one given over to his arm for the purpose of shedding blood. (**Ezekiel 22:6**)
- Joyfully cry out, **you** heavens, for Yehowah **has** taken action! Shout in triumph, all **you** lowest parts of the earth! Become cheerful, **you mountains**, with joyful outcry, you forest and all **you** trees in it! For Yehowah **has** repurchased Jacob, and on **Israel** he shows his beauty. (**Isaiah 44:23**)
- Give a glad cry, **you** heavens, and be joyful, you earth. Let the **mountains** become cheerful with a glad outcry. For Yehowah **has** comforted his people, and he shows pity upon his own afflicted **ones**. (**Isaiah 49:13**)
- Son of man, set your face toward the **mountains** of **Israel** and prophesy to them. (**Ezekiel 6:2**)
- Here I am sending and I will take all the families of the north, is the utterance of Yehowah, even sending to Nebuchadrezzar the king of Babylon, my servant, and I will bring them against this

- land and against its inhabitants and against all these **nations round about**, and I will devote them to destruction and make them an object of astonishment and something to whistle at and **places devastated** to time indefinite. (**Jeremiah 25:9**)
- We **have** become a reproach to our neighbors, a derision and a jeering to those **round about** us. (**Psalms 79:4**)
  - And they will no longer become something to **plunder** for the **nations**, and as regards the wild beast of the earth, it will not devour them, and they will actually dwell in security, with no one to make them tremble. (**Ezekiel 34:28**)
  - For the fortified city will be solitary, the pasture ground will be left to itself and **abandoned** like a wilderness. There the calf will graze, and there it will lie down, and he will actually consume her boughs. (**Isaiah 27:10**)
  - Son of man, the inhabitants of these **devastated places** are saying even concerning the soil of **Israel**, Abraham happened to be just one and yet he took possession of the land. And we are many, to us the land **has** been given as something to possess. (**Ezekiel 33:24**)
