- I saw also an angel standing in the sun, and he cried out with a loud voice and said to all the birds that fly in midheaven; Come here, be gathered together to the great evening meal of God. (**Revelation 19:17**)
- That **you** may eat the fleshy parts of kings and the fleshy parts of military commanders and the fleshy parts of strong men and the fleshy parts of horses and of those seated upon them, and the fleshy parts of all, of freemen as well as of slaves and of small ones and great. (**Revelation 19:18**)
- And I saw the wild beast and the kings of the earth and their armies gathered together to wage the war with the one seated on the horse and with his army. (**Revelation 19:19**)
- And the wild beast was caught, and along with it the false prophet that performed in front of it the signs with which he misled those who received the mark of the wild beast and those who render worship to its image. While still alive, they both were hurled into the fiery lake that burns with sulphur. (**Revelation 19:20**)
- But the rest were killed off with the long sword of the one seated on the horse, which sword proceeded out of his mouth. And all the birds were filled from the fleshy parts of them. (**Revelation 19:21**)
- Persians and Ludim and men of **Put**, they happened to be in your military force, your men of war. Shield and **helmet** they hung up in you. They were the ones that caused your splendor. (**Ezekiel 27:10**)
- **Ethiopia** and **Put** and Lud and all the mixed company and Chub and the sons of the land of the covenant, with them they will fall by the very sword. (**Ezekiel 30:5**)
- The sons of Ham were Cush and Mizraim, **Put** and Canaan. (**1 Chronicles 1:8**)

- **Go up, O you horses, and drive madly, O you chariots! And let the mighty men go forth, Cush and Put, who are handling the shield, and the Ludim, who are handling and treading the bow.
