

**Ezekiel 40:1**

**In the twenty-fifth year of our exile, in the start of the year, on the tenth day of the month, in the fourteenth year after the city had been struck down, on this very same day the hand of Yehowah proved to be upon me, so that he brought me to that place.**

- Thus he took Jehoiachin into **exile** to Babylon, and the king's mother and the king's wives and his court officials and the foremost men of the land he led away as exiled people from Jerusalem to Babylon. (**2 Kings 24:15**)
- And he proceeded to burn the house of Yehowah and the king's house and all the houses of Jerusalem, and the house of every great man he burned with fire. (**2 Kings 25:9**)
- And he proceeded to burn the house of the true God and pull **down** the wall of Jerusalem, and all its dwelling towers they burned with fire and also all its desirable articles, so as to cause ruin. (**2 Chronicles 36:19**)
- At length it occurred in the twelfth **year**, in the **tenth month**, on the fifth **day** of the **month** of our **exile**, that there came to me the escaped one from Jerusalem, saying; The **city** has been **struck down**! (**Ezekiel 33:21**)
- The word of Yehowah occurred specifically to Ezekiel the son of Buzi the priest in the land of the Chaldeans by the river Chebar, and upon him in that **place** the **hand** of Yehowah came to be. (**Ezekiel 1:3**)
- Then he thrust out the representation of a **hand** and took me by a tuft of hair of my head, and a spirit carried me between the earth and the heavens and **brought** me to Jerusalem in the visions of God, to the entrance of the inner gate that is facing northward, where the dwelling **place** is of the symbol of jealousy that is inciting to jealousy. (**Ezekiel 8:3**)
