In front of the twenty cubits that belonged to the inner courtyard and in front of the pavement that belonged to the outer courtyard there was gallery opposite gallery in three stories.

- By presenting upon my altar polluted bread. And you have said; In what way have we polluted you? By your saying; The table of Yehowah is something to be despised. (Malachi 1:7)
- And when you present a blind animal for sacrificing; It is nothing bad. And when you present a lame animal or a sick one; It is nothing bad. Bring it near, please, to your governor. Will he find pleasure in you, or will he receive you kindly? Yehowah of armies has said. (Malachi 1:8)
- And between the dining rooms the width was twenty cubits round about the house, all around. (Ezekiel 41:10)
- And all the sons of Israel were spectators when the fire came down and the glory of Yehowah was upon the house, and they immediately bowed low with their faces to the earth upon the pavement and prostrated themselves and thanked Yehowah, for he is good, for his loving-kindness is to time indefinite. (2 Chronicles 7:3)
- And the pavement at the side of the gates was exactly as the length of the gates, the lower pavement. (Ezekiel 40:18)
- The thresholds, and the windows with narrowing frames, and the galleries were round about the three of them. In front of the threshold there was paneling of wood all around, and from the floor up to the windows, and the windows were covered ones. (Ezekiel 41:16)
