From this there will prove to be for the holy place¹ five hundred by five hundred, it being made square round about, and fifty cubits it will have as pasture ground on each side.

- For the four sides he measured it. It had a wall all around, with a length of five hundred reeds and a width of five hundred reeds, to make a division between what is holy and what is profane. (Ezekiel 42:20)
- And they proceeded to speak to them in Shiloh in the land of Canaan, saying; Yehowah by means of Moses commanded cities to be given us in which to dwell, together with their pasture grounds for our domestic animals. (Joshua 21:2)
- And the city must come to have a pasture ground, to the north two hundred and fifty cubits, and to the south two hundred and fifty, and to the east two hundred and fifty, and to the west two hundred and fifty. (Ezekiel 48:17)
