

Ezekiel 7:5 This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said; A calamity, a unique calamity, look! It is coming.

[7] - References:

- And when he got nearby, he viewed the city and wept over it. (Luke 19:41)
- Saying; If you, even you, had discerned in this day the things having to do with peace, but now they have been hid from your eyes. (Luke 19:42)
- Because the days will come upon you when your enemies will build around you a fortification with pointed stakes and will encircle you and distress you from every side. (Luke 19:43)
- Why have the nations been in tumult and the national groups themselves kept muttering an empty thing? (Psalms 2:1)
- The kings of earth take their stand and high officials themselves have massed together as one against Yehowah and against his anointed one. (Psalms 2:2)
- Saying; Let us tear their bands apart and cast their cords away from us! (Psalms 2:3)
- The very One sitting in the heavens will laugh, Yehowah himself will hold them in derision. (Psalms 2:4)
- At that time he will speak to them in his anger and in his hot displeasure he will disturb them. (Psalms 2:5)
- Saying; I, even I, have installed my king upon Zion, my holy mountain. (Psalms 2:6)
- Let me refer to the decree of Yehowah, he has said to me You are my son, I, today, I have become your father. (Psalms 2:7)
- Ask of me, that I may give nations as your inheritance and the ends of the earth as your own possession. (Psalms 2:8)
- You will break them with an iron scepter, as though a potter's vessel you will dash them to pieces. (Psalms 2:9)
- And now, O kings, exercise insight, let yourselves be corrected, O judges of the earth. (Psalms 2:10)

- **Serve Yehowah with fear and be joyful with trembling. (Psalms 2:11)**
- **Kiss the son, that He may not become incensed and **you** may not perish from the way, for his anger flares up easily. Happy are all those taking refuge in him. (Psalms 2:12)**
- **And I saw in the right hand of the One seated upon the throne a scroll written within and on the reverse side, sealed tight with seven seals. (Revelation 5:1)**
- **And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice; Who is worthy to open the scroll and loose its seals? (Revelation 5:2)**
- **But neither in heaven nor upon earth nor underneath the earth was there a single one able to open the scroll or to **look** into it. (Revelation 5:3)**
- **And I gave way to a great deal of weeping because no one was found worthy to open the scroll or to **look** into it. (Revelation 5:4)**
- **But one of the elders says to me; Stop weeping. Look! The Lion that is of the tribe of Judah, the root of David, **has** conquered so as to open the scroll and its seven seals. (Revelation 5:5)**
- **Therefore, when **you** catch sight of the disgusting thing that causes desolation, as spoken of through Daniel the prophet, standing in a holy place, let the reader use discernment. (Matthew 24:15)**
- **Then let those in Judea begin fleeing to the mountains. (Matthew 24:16)**
- **Let the man on the housetop not come down to take the goods out of his house. (Matthew 24:17)**
- **And let the man in the field not return to the house to pick up his outer garment. (Matthew 24:18)**
- **Woe to the pregnant women and those suckling a baby in those days! (Matthew 24:19)**
- **Keep praying that **your** flight may not occur in wintertime, nor on the Sabbath day. (Matthew 24:20)**

- For then there will be great tribulation such as **has** not occurred since the world's beginning until now, no, nor will occur again. (**Matthew 24:21**)
- That is why this is **what** Yehowah the God of Israel **has said**; Here I am bringing a **calamity** upon Jerusalem and Judah, of which if anyone hears both his ears will tingle. (**2 Kings 21:12**)
- And he proceeded to carry out his words that he had spoken against us and against our judges who judged us, by bringing upon us great **calamity**, such as was not done under the whole heavens as **what has** been done in Jerusalem. (**Daniel 9:12**)
- Therefore this is **what** Yehowah **has said**; Here I am bringing upon them a **calamity** that they will not be able to get out of, and they will certainly call to me for aid, but I shall not listen to them. (**Jeremiah 11:11**)
