[13] - References

- The inclination that is well supported you will safeguard in continuous peace, because it is in you that one is made to trust. (Isaiah 26:3)
- For the Scripture says: None that rests his faith on him will be disappointed. (Romans 10:11)
- That my enemy may not say; I have won out over him! That my adversaries themselves may not be joyful because I am made to stagger. (Psalms 13:4)
- O may those who for no reason are my enemies not rejoice over me, as for those hating me without cause, let them not wink the eye. (Psalms 35:19)
