- The thing that Isaiah the son of Amoz visioned concerning Judah and Jerusalem. (Isaiah 2:1)
- And it must occur in the final part of the days that the mountain of the house of Yehowah will become firmly established above the top of the mountains, and it will certainly be lifted up above the hills, and to it all the nations must stream. (Isaiah 2:2)
- And many peoples will certainly go and say; Come, you people, and let us go up to the mountain of Yehowah, to the house of the God of Jacob, and he will instruct us about his ways, and we will walk in his paths. For out of Zion Law will go forth, and the word of Yehowah out of Jerusalem. (Isaiah 2:3)
- And he will certainly render judgment among the nations and set matters straight respecting many peoples. And they will have to beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning shears. Nation will not lift up sword against nation, neither will they learn war anymore. (Isaiah 2:4)
- O men of the house of Jacob, come and let us walk in the light of Yehowah. (Isaiah 2:5)
- And it must occur in the final part of the days that the mountain of the house of Yehowah will become firmly established above the top of the mountains, and it will certainly be lifted up above the hills, and to it peoples must stream. (Micah 4:1)
- And many nations will certainly go and say; Come, you people, and let us go up to the mountain of Yehowah and to the house of the

God of Jacob, and he will instruct us about his ways, and we will walk in his paths. For out of Zion Law will go forth, and the word of Yehowah out of Jerusalem. (Micah 4:2)

- And he will certainly render judgment among many peoples, and set matters straight respecting mighty nations far away. And they will have to beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning shears. They will not lift up sword, nation against nation, neither will they learn war anymore. (Micah 4:3)
- And they will actually sit, each one under his vine and under his fig tree, and there will be no one making them tremble, for the very mouth of Yehowah of armies has spoken it. (Micah 4:4)
- For all the peoples, for their part, will walk each one in the name of its god, but we, for our part, shall walk in the name of Yehowah our God to time indefinite, even forever. (Micah 4:5)
- And the foreigners that have joined themselves to Yehowah to minister to him and to love the name of Yehowah, in order to become servants to him, all those keeping the Sabbath in order not to profane it and laying hold of my covenant. (Isaiah 56:6)
- And nations will certainly go to your light, and kings to the brightness of your shining forth. (Isaiah 60:3)
- And they will actually bring all YOUR brothers out of all the nations as a gift to Yehowah, on horses and in chariots and in covered wagons and on mules and on swift she-camels, up to my holy mountain, Jerusalem, Yehowah has said, just as when the sons of Israel bring the gift in a clean vessel into the house of Yehowah. (Isaiah 66:20)
- And many peoples and mighty nations will actually come to seek Yehowah of armies in Jerusalem and to soften the face of Yehowah. (Zechariah 8:22)
- This is what Yehowah of armies has said; It will be in those days that ten men out of all the languages of the nations will take hold, yes, they will actually take hold of the skirt of a man who is a Jew, saying; We will go with you people, for we have heard that God is with you people. (Zechariah 8:23)
- And I shall indeed remember my covenant with Jacob, and even my covenant with Isaac and even my covenant with Abraham I shall remember, and the land I shall remember. (Leviticus 26:42)

- For Yehowah your God is a merciful God. He will not desert you or bring you to ruin or forget the covenant of your forefathers that he swore to them. (Deuteronomy 4:31)
- Yehowah your God must also bring back your captives and show you mercy and collect you again from all the peoples where Yehowah your God has scattered you. (Deuteronomy 30:3)
- Call out further, saying; This is what Yehowah of armies has said; My cities will yet overflow with goodness, and Yehowah will yet certainly feel regrets over Zion and yet actually choose Jerusalem. (Zechariah 1:17)
- What, then? The very thing Israel is earnestly seeking he did not obtain, but the ones chosen obtained it. The rest had their sensibilities blunted. (Romans 11:7)
- And I will set my eye upon them in a good way, and I shall certainly cause them to return to this land. And I will build them up, and I shall not tear down, and I will plant them, and I shall not uproot. (Jeremiah 24:6)
- And I will take you out of the nations and collect you together out of all the lands and bring you in upon your soil. (Ezekiel 36:24)
- All the Nethinim and the sons of the servants of Solomon were three hundred and ninety-two. (Ezra 2:58)
- And the Nethinim were dwelling in Ophel, and Ziha and Gishpa were over the Nethinim. (Nehemiah 11:21)
- And in all the different jurisdictional districts and in all the different cities wherever the word of the king and his Law were reaching there were rejoicing and exultation for the Jews, a banquet and a good day, and many of the peoples of the land were declaring themselves Jews, for the dread of the Jews had fallen upon them. (Esther 8:17)
- And Ruth proceeded to say; Do not plead with me to abandon you, to turn back from accompanying you, for where you go I shall go, and where you spend the night I shall spend the night. Your people will be my people, and your God my God. (Ruth 1:16)
- For the mountains themselves may be removed, and the very hills may stagger, but my loving-kindness itself will not be removed from you, nor will my covenant of peace itself stagger, Yehowah, the One having mercy upon you, has said. (Isaiah 54:10)

- And strangers will actually stand and shepherd the flocks of you people, and the foreigners will be your farmers and your vinedressers. (Isaiah 61:5)
- In the face of these things will you continue keeping yourself in check, O Yehowah? Will you stay still and let us be afflicted to the extreme? (Isaiah 64:12)
- So too I would reject even the seed of Jacob and of David my servant, so that I should not take from his seed rulers over the seed of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. For I shall gather their captives and will have pity upon them. (Jeremiah 33:26)
