## CHRIST - CALL ME IN THE DAY OF DISTRESS, I SHALL RESCUE YOU

Messianic ··· Prophecy ··· Christ - Call me in the day of distress, I shall rescue you and you shall glorify me · (Psalms 50:15) [53] - References

Psalms 50:15... And call me in the day of distress. I shall rescue you, and you will glorify me.

[53] - References

- And as soon as it caused him distress, he softened the face of Yehowah his God and kept humbling himself greatly because of the God of his forefathers. (2 Chronicles 33:12)
- In the day of my distress I have searched for Yehowah himself. At night my very hand has been stretched out and does not grow numb, my soul has refused to be comforted. (Psalms 77:2)
- He will call upon me, and I shall answer him. I shall be with him in distress. I shall rescue him and glorify him. (Psalms 91:15)
- At length when the hour came, he reclined at the table, and the apostles with him. (Luke 22:14)
- You fearers of Yehowah, praise him! All you the seed of Jacob, glorify him! And be frightened at him, all you the seed of Israel. (Psalms 22:23)
- Then he cried out to Yehowah. So Yehowah directed him to a tree, and he threw it into the water and the water became sweet. There He established for them a regulation and a case for judgment and there he put them to the test. (Exodus 15:25)
- And the sons of Israel began to call to Yehowah for aid. So Yehowah raised up for them a savior, Ehud the son of Gera, a Benjamite, a left-handed man. In time the sons of Israel sent tribute by his hand to Eglon the king of Moab. (Judges 3:15)
- And Israel became greatly impoverished due to Midian, and the sons of Israel began to call to Yehowah for aid. (Judges 6:6)
- Samson now called to Yehowah and said; Sovereign Lord Yehowah, remember me, please, and strengthen me, please, just this

once, O you the true God, and let me avenge myself upon the Philistines with vengeance for one of my two eyes. (Judges 16:28)

- Then Samuel took a sucking lamb and offered it up as a burnt offering, a whole offering, to Yehowah, and Samuel began calling to Yehowah for aid in behalf of Israel, and Yehowah proceeded to answer him. (1 Samuel 7:9)
- And David went on to say; O Yehowah the God of Israel, your servant has definitely heard that Saul is seeking to come to Keilah to lay the city in ruin on my account. (1 Samuel 23:10)
- And to David the report was made, saying; Ahithophel himself is among those conspiring with Absalom. At this David said; Turn, please, the counsel of Ahithophel into foolishness, O Yehowah! (2 Samuel 15:31)
- And it came about that, as soon as the chiefs of the chariots saw Jehoshaphat, they, for their part, said to themselves; Surely it is the king of Israel. So they turned aside against him to fight, and Jehoshaphat began to cry for aid. (1 Kings 22:32)
- In time Jehoahaz softened the face of Yehowah, so that Yehowah listened to him, for he had seen the oppression upon Israel, because the king of Syria had oppressed them. (2 Kings 13:4)
- Perhaps Yehowah your God will hear all the words of Rabshakeh, whom the king of Assyria his lord sent to taunt the living God, and he will actually call him to account for the words that Yehowah your God has heard. And you must lift up prayer in behalf of the remnant that are to be found. (2 Kings 19:4)
- At that he turned his face to the wall and began to pray to Yehowah, saying; (2 Kings 20:2)
- And Jabez began to call upon the God of Israel, saying; If you will without fail bless me and actually enlarge my territory and your hand really proves to be with me, and you really preserve me from calamity, that it may not hurt me. Accordingly God brought to pass what he had asked. (1 Chronicles 4:10)
- When those of Judah turned around, why, there they had the battle in front and behind. And they began to cry out to Yehowah, while the priests were loudly sounding the trumpets. (2 Chronicles 13:14)

- And it came about that, as soon as the chiefs of the chariots saw Jehoshaphat, they, for their part, said to themselves; It is the king of Israel. So they turned around against him to fight, and Jehoshaphat began to cry for aid, and Yehowah himself helped him, and God at once allured them away from him. (2 Chronicles 18:31)
- Is not Hezekiah alluring you so as to give you over to die by famine and by thirst, saying; Yehowah our God himself will deliver us out of the palm of the king of Assyria? (2 Chronicles 32:11)
- But Hezekiah the king and Isaiah the son of Amoz, the prophet, kept praying over this and crying to the heavens for aid. (2 Chronicles 32:20)
- But we prayed to our God and kept a guard posted against them day and night on account of them. (Nehemiah 4:9)
- Do return, O Yehowah, do rescue my soul, save me for the sake of your loving-kindness. (Psalms 6:4)
- On the One to be praised, Yehowah, I shall call, and from my enemies I shall be saved. (Psalms 18:3)
- In my distress I kept calling upon Yehowah, and to my God I kept crying for help. Out of his temple he proceeded to hear my voice, and my own cry before him for help now came into his ears. (Psalms 18:6)
- Be pleased, O Yehowah, to deliver me. O Yehowah, to my assistance do make haste. (Psalms 40:13)
- I will laud you to time indefinite, for you have taken action, and I shall hope in your name, because it is good, in front of your loyal ones. (Psalms 52:9)
- As for me, to God I shall call out, and Yehowah himself will save me. (Psalms 55:16)
- In distress you called, and I proceeded to rescue you, I began to answer you in the concealed place of thunder. I went examining you at the waters of Meribah. (Psalms 81:7)
- In the day of my distress I will call upon you, for you will answer me. (Psalms 86:7)
- And they kept crying out to Yehowah in their distress, out of the stresses upon them he proceeded to deliver them. (Psalms 107:6)

- Out of the distressing circumstances I called upon Yah, Yah answered and put me into a roomy place. (Psalms 118:5)
- To Yehowah I called in the distress of mine, and he proceeded to answer me. (Psalms 120:1)
- With my voice, to Yehowah I proceeded to call for aid, with my voice, to Yehowah I began to cry for favor. (Psalms 142:1)
- The desire of those fearing him he will perform, and their cry for help he will hear, and he will save them. (Psalms 145:19)
- And it must prove to be for a sign and for a witness to Yehowah of armies in the land of Egypt, for they will cry out to Yehowah because of the oppressors, and he will send them a savior, even a grand one, who will actually deliver them. (Isaiah 19:20)
- When the very people in Zion will dwell in Jerusalem, you will by no means weep. He will without fail show you favor at the sound of your outcry, as soon as he hears it he will actually answer you. (Isaiah 30:19)
- And they proceeded to say to him; This is what Hezekiah has said; This day is a day of distress and of rebuke and of scornful insolence, for the sons have come as far as the womb's mouth, and there is no power to give birth. (Isaiah 37:3)
- Perhaps Yehowah your God will hear the words of Rabshakeh, whom the king of Assyria his lord sent to taunt the living God, and he will actually call him to account for the words that Yehowah your God has heard. And you must lift up prayer in behalf of the remnant that are to be found. (Isaiah 37:4)
- At that Hezekiah turned his face to the wall and began to pray to Yehowah (Isaiah 38:2)
- Call to me, and I shall answer you and readily tell you great and incomprehensible things that you have not known. (Jeremiah 33:3)
- And I will deliver you in that day, is the utterance of Yehowah, and you will not be given into the hand of the men of whom you yourself are scared. (Jeremiah 39:17)
- Even for them to ask for mercies on the part of the God of heaven concerning this secret, in order, that they might not destroy Daniel and his companions with the remainder of the wise men of Babylon. (Daniel 2:18)

- Then it was that to Daniel in a night vision the secret was revealed. Consequently Daniel himself blessed the God of heaven. (Daniel 2:19)
- Sanctify a time of fasting. Call together a solemn assembly. Gather together the older men, all the inhabitants of the land, to the house of Yehowah YOUR God, and cry to Yehowah for aid. (Joel 1:14)
- To you, O Yehowah, I shall call, for fire itself has devoured the pasture grounds of the wilderness, and a very flame has consumed all the trees of the field. (Joel 1:19)
- And it must occur that everyone who calls on the name of Yehowah will get away safe, for in Mount Zion and in Jerusalem there will prove to be the escaped ones, just as Yehowah has said, and in among the survivors, whom Yehowah is calling. (Joel 2:32)
- And out of Zion Yehowah himself will roar, and out of Jerusalem he will give forth his voice. And heaven and earth certainly will rock, but Yehowah will be a refuge for his people, and a fortress for the sons of Israel. (Joel 3:16)
- At that the men began to fear Yehowah greatly, and so they offered a sacrifice to Yehowah and made vows. (Jonah 1:16)
- Yehowah is good, a stronghold in the day of distress. And he is cognizant of those seeking refuge in him. (Nahum 1:7)
- For everyone asking receives, and everyone seeking finds, and to everyone knocking it will be opened. (Luke 11:10)
- One of them, when he saw he was healed, turned back, glorifying God with a loud voice. (Luke 17:15)
- Is there anyone suffering evil among YOU? Let him carry on prayer. Is there anyone in good spirits? Let him sing psalms. (James 5:13)
