Isaiah 42:3· **No crushed reed will he break, and as for a dim flaxen wick, he will not extinguish it. In trueness he will bring forth justice.**

- Like a shepherd he **will** shepherd his own drove. With his arm he **will** collect together the lambs, and in his bosom he **will** carry them. Those giving suck he **will** conduct with care. (**Isaiah 40:11**)
- Come to me, all **you** who are toiling and loaded down, and I **will** refresh **you**. (**Matthew 11:28**)
- Take my yoke upon **you** and learn from me, for I am mild-tempered and lowly in heart, and **you will** find refreshment for **your** souls. (**Matthew 11:29**)
- Consequently he was obliged to become like his brothers in all respects, that he might become a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God, in order to offer propitiatory sacrifice for the sins of the people. (**Hebrews 2:17**)
- May he plead the cause of your people with righteousness and of your afflicted ones with judicial decision. (**Psalms 72:2**)
- Let the mountains carry peace to the people, also the hills, through righteousness. (**Psalms 72:3**)
- Let him judge the afflicted ones of the people, let him save the sons of the poor one, and let him crush the defrauder. (**Psalms 72:4**)
- And there **will** be enjoyment by him in the fear of Yehowah. And he **will** not judge by any mere appearance to his eyes, nor reprove simply according to the thing heard by his ears. (**Isaiah 11:3**)
- And with righteousness he must judge the lowly ones, and with uprightness he must give reproof in behalf of the meek ones of the earth. And he must strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and

with the spirit of his lips he **will** put the wicked one to death. (**Isaiah 11:4**)

- And righteousness must prove to be the belt of his hips, and faithfulness the belt of his loins. (**Isaiah 11:5**)

- Look! My servant whom I chose, my beloved, whom my soul approved! I **will** put my spirit upon him, and what **justice** is he **will** make clear to the nations. (**Matthew 12:18**)

- He **will** not wrangle, nor cry aloud, nor **will** anyone hear his voice in the broad ways. (**Matthew 12:19**)

- No bruised **reed will** he crush, and no smoldering **flaxen wick will** he **extinguish**, until he sends out **justice** with success. (**Matthew 12:20**)

- Indeed, in his name nations **will** hope. (**Matthew 12:21**)

- I cannot do a single thing of my own initiative, just as I hear, I judge, and the judgment that I render is righteous, because I seek, not my own **will**, but the **will** of him that sent me. (**John 5:30**)

- And I saw the heaven opened, and, look! A white horse. And the one seated upon it is called Faithful and True, and he judges and carries on war in righteousness. (**Revelation 19:11**)

- The One bringing forth the war chariot and the horse, the military force and the strong ones at the same time; They **will** lie down. They **will** not get up. They **will** certainly be extinguished. Like a **flaxen wick** they must be put out. (**Isaiah 43:17**)

- Yehowah's spirit is upon me, because he anointed me to declare Good News to the poor, he sent me forth to preach a release to the captives and a recovery of sight to the blind, to send the crushed ones away with a release. (**Luke 4:18**)
