**Psalms 109:5**.. **And they render to me bad for good and hatred for my love.**

- For without cause they have hid for me their netted pit, without cause they have dug it for my soul. (**Psalms 35:7**)
- And they were rewarding me with **bad** for **good**, they kept resisting me in return for my pursuing what is **good**. (**Psalms 38:20**)
- As for anyone repaying **bad** for **good**, **bad** will not move away from his house. (**Proverbs 17:13**)
- For it was not an enemy that proceeded to reproach me, otherwise I could put up with it. It was not an intense hater of me that assumed great airs against me, otherwise I could conceal myself from him. (**Psalms 55:12**)
- They went out of the city. They had not gone far when Joseph said to the man who was over his house; Get up! Chase after the men and be certain to overtake them and to say to them, Why have **you** repaid **bad** for **good**? (**Genesis 44:4**)
- Accordingly Jonathan spoke well of David to Saul his father and said to him; Do not let the king sin against his servant David, for he has not sinned toward you and his works have been very **good** toward you. (**1 Samuel 19:4**)
- As for David, he had said; It was altogether for disappointment that I guarded everything that belongs to this fellow in the wilderness and not a single thing of all that belongs to him showed up missing, and yet he repays me evil in return for **good**. (**1 Samuel 25:21**)
- All the men of my intimate group detest me, and those whom I loved have turned against me. (**Job 19:19**)
- They reward me with **bad** for **good**, bereavement to my soul. (**Psalms 35:12**)

- Should **bad** be repaid for **good**? For they have excavated a pit for my soul. Remember my standing before you to speak **good** even concerning them, to turn back your rage from them. (**Jeremiah 18:20**)
- And they proceeded to take Jeremiah and throw him into the cistern of Malchijah the son of the king, which was in the Courtyard of the Guard. So they let Jeremiah down by means of ropes. Now in the cistern there was no water, but mire, and Jeremiah began to sink down into the mire. (**Jeremiah 38:6**)
