Isaiah 40:11... Like a shepherd he will shepherd his own drove. With his arm he will collect together the lambs, and in his bosom he will carry them. Those giving suck he will conduct with care.

- And I myself shall **collect together** the remnant of my sheep out of all the lands to which I had dispersed them, and I **will** bring them back to their pasture ground, and they **will** certainly be fruitful and become many. (**Jeremiah 23:3**)
- And I **will** raise up over them **shepherds** who **will** actually **shepherd** them, and they **will** be afraid no more, neither **will** they be struck with any terror, and none **will** be missing, is the utterance of Yehowah. (**Jeremiah 23:4**)
- Therefore, **you shepherds**, hear the word of Yehowah. (**Ezekiel 34:7**)
- As I am alive, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah, surely for the reason that my sheep became something for plunder and my sheep continued to be food for every wild beast of the field, because there was no **shepherd**, and my **shepherds** did not search for my sheep, but the **shepherds** kept feeding themselves, and my **own** sheep they did not feed. (**Ezekiel 34:8**)
- Therefore, **you shepherds**, hear the word of Yehowah. (**Ezekiel 34:9**)
- This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said; Here I am against the **shepherds**, and I shall certainly ask back my sheep from their hand and make them cease from feeding my sheep, and the **shepherds will** no longer feed themselves, and I **will** deliver my sheep out of their mouth, and they **will** not become food for them. (**Ezekiel 34:10**)

• For this is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said; Here I am, I myself, and I **will** search for my sheep and **care** for them. (**Ezekiel 34:11**)

• According to the **care** of one feeding his **drove** in the day of his coming to be in the midst of his sheep that have been spread abroad, that is the way that I shall **care** for my sheep, and I **will** deliver them out of all the places to which they have been scattered in the day of clouds and thick gloom. (**Ezekiel 34:12**)

• And I **will** bring them out from the peoples and **collect** them **together** from the lands and bring them in onto their soil and feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the streambeds and by all the dwelling places of the land. (**Ezekiel 34:13**)

• In a good pasturage I shall feed them, and on Israel's high mountains their abiding place **will** come to be. There they **will** lie down in a good abiding place, and on a fat pasturage they **will** feed upon the mountains of Israel. (**Ezekiel 34:14**)

• I myself shall feed my sheep, and I myself shall make them lie down, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah. (**Ezekiel 34:15**)

• The lost one I shall search for, and the dispersed one I shall bring back, and the broken one I shall bandage and the ailing one I shall strengthen, but the fat one and the strong one I shall annihilate. I shall feed that one with judgment. (**Ezekiel 34:16**)

• But he said to him; My lord is aware that the children are delicate and sheep and cattle that are **giving suck** are in my charge, and should they drive them too quickly for one day, then the whole flock **will** certainly die. (**Genesis 33:13**)

• Let my lord, please, pass on ahead of his servant, but may I myself continue the journey at my leisure according to the pace of the livestock that is before me and according to the pace of the children until I shall come to my lord at Seir. (**Genesis 33:14**)

• Have I myself conceived all this people? Is it I who have given them birth, so that you should say to me, Carry them in your **bosom**, just as the male nurse carries the suckling, to the soil about which you swore to their forefathers? (**Numbers 11:12**)

• A hiding place is the God of ancient time, and underneath are the indefinitely lasting **arms**. And he **will** drive away from before you the enemy, and he **will** say; Annihilate them! (**Deuteronomy 33:27**)

- In case my **own** father and my **own** mother did leave me, even Yehowah himself would take me up. (**Psalms 27:10**)
- Do save your people, and bless your inheritance, and **shepherd** them and **carry** them to time indefinite. (**Psalms 28:9**)
- O Shepherd of Israel, do give ear, you who are conducting Joseph just like a flock. O you who are sitting upon the cherubs, do beam forth. (**Psalms 80:1**)
- For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasturage and the sheep of his hand. Today if **you** people listen to his **own** voice. (**Psalms 95:7**)
- You are beautiful, O girl companion of mine, like Pleasant City, comely like Jerusalem, awesome as companies gathered around banners. (**Song of Solomon 6:4**)
- No crushed reed **will** he break, and as for a dim flaxen wick, he **will** not extinguish it. In trueness he **will** bring forth justice. (**Isaiah 42:3**)
- Hear the word of Yehowah, O **you** nations, and tell it among the islands far away, and say; The One scattering Israel **will** himself **collect** him **together**, and he **will** certainly keep him as a **shepherd** does his **drove**. (**Jeremiah 31:10**)
- Son of man, prophesy against the **shepherds** of Israel. Prophesy, and you must say to them, to the **shepherds**, This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said; Woe to the **shepherds** of Israel, who have become feeders of themselves! Is it not the flock that the **shepherds** ought to feed? (**Ezekiel 34:2**)
- According to the **care** of one feeding his **drove** in the day of his coming to be in the midst of his sheep that have been spread abroad, that is the way that I shall **care** for my sheep, and I **will** deliver them out of all the places to which they have been scattered in the day of clouds and thick gloom. (**Ezekiel 34:12**)
- And I **will** save my sheep, and they **will** no longer become something for plunder, and I **will** judge between a sheep and a sheep. (**Ezekiel 34:22**)
- But as for me, I taught Ephraim to walk, taking them upon my **arms**, and they did not recognize that I had healed them. (**Hosea 11:3**)
- Shepherd your people with your staff, the flock of your inheritance, the one who was residing alone in a forest, in the midst of

an orchard. Let them feed on Bashan and Gilead as in the days of a long time ago. (**Micah 7:14**)

- And I proceeded to **shepherd** the flock meant for the killing, in **YOUR** behalf, O afflicted ones of the flock. So I took for myself two staffs. The one I called Pleasantness, and the other I called Union, and I went shepherding the flock. (**Zechariah 11:7**)

- Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the killer of the prophets and stoner of those sent forth to her, how often I wanted to gather your children **together** in the manner that a hen gathers her brood of chicks under her wings, but **you** people did not want it! (**Luke 13:34**)

- Shepherd the flock of God in **YOUR care**, not under compulsion, but willingly, neither for love of dishonest gain, but eagerly. (**1 Peter 5:2**)
