John 10:2~ But he that enters through the door is shepherd of the sheep.

1. Then Jesus showed, that the one that enters the sheepfold through the door is the shepherd of the sheep. Now Yehowah God was himself that shepherd, and Jesus was the door, through which true shepherds entered into godly service, they must come through the door, or they were thieves and plunderers.

[Question] Who though, does enter the sheepfold through the door?

[Question] Who now, was that one who entered through the door, and what was the door?

[Question] Who then, must anointed Christians enter through, to perform true godly service for the great shepherd, Yehowah God?

2. I am the door, whoever enters through me will be saved, and he will go in and out and find pasturage. (John 10:9)

[Question] What did Jesus identify himself as, regarding this sheepfold?

[Question] Who then, must his disciples enter through, to find salvation and good pasturage?

3. Then Jesus said to them; All of you will be stumbled in connection with me on this night, for it is written: I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered about. (Matthew 26:31)

[Question] How did Jesus show, how all his sheep would be stumbled, when he himself was killed?

4. I am the fine shepherd, the fine shepherd surrenders his soul in behalf of the sheep. (John 10:11)

[Question] What did Jesus identify himself as, and how does this one protect his sheep?

5. And Jesus said to them; You will all be stumbled, because it is written: I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered about. (Mark 14:27)

[Question] What did Jesus foretell for his little flock on the night of his death?

6 Have no fear, little flock, because your Father has approved

of giving you the kingdom. (Luke 12:32)

[Question] Why did Jesus tell that little flock, not to fear?

And, look! There was a wall outside the house all round about. And in the hand of the man, there was the measuring reed of six cubits, by a cubit and a handbreadth. And he began to measure the breadth of the thing built, one reed, and the height, one reed. (Ezekiel 40:5)

[Question] What wall surrounded the visionary temple of Ezekiel, and who would this keep, out like a sheepfold?
