[Question] What did Jesus mean by saying, that he and his Father were one?

2. But if I am doing them, even though you do not believe me, believe the works, in order, that you may come to know, and may continue knowing, that the Father is in union with me, and I am in union with the Father. (John 10:38)

[Question] What did Jesus show, was convincing enough evidence, for his disciples to believe in him?

[Question] What would this prove to them, that Jesus was, in relation to his heavenly Father?

3. Also, I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, watch over them on account of your own name, which you have given me, in order, that they may be one, just as we are. (John 17:11)

[Question] Why did Jesus ask his father to watch over his disciples, for what did Jesus want his disciples to experience, that he already possessed with his Father?

4. In order, that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in union with me, and I am in union with you, that they also may be in union with us, in order, that the world may believe, that you sent me forth. (John 17:21)

[Question] What kind of unity of thought and purpose, did Jesus want his disciples to have, just as he had with Yehowah God?

5. He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. (Colossians 1:15)
