John 10:33~ The Jews answered him; We are stoning you, not for a fine work, but for blasphemy, even because you, although being a man, make yourself a god.

1. So the Jews answered, that they were stoning, him not in relation to his fine works, but for blasphemy. They could see that he was a man like them, yet they felt, that he was trying to make himself a god, by saying, that he and the Father were one.

[Question] How then, did the Jews answer Jesus, for what did they consider his words to be?

[Question] What did they feel, that Jesus was trying to make of himself?

2. So the abuser of Yehowah's name should be put to death without fail. The entire assembly should without fail pelt him with stones. The alien resident the same as the native should be put to death for his abusing the Name. (Leviticus 24:16)

[Question] What was to be done within Israel under the Law Covenant to any man abusing the name of Yehowah God?

3. And, look! Certain of the scribes said to themselves; This fellow is blaspheming. (Matthew 9:3)

[Question] How did certain ones of the scribes feel, when they heard what Jesus had to say?

4. Then the High Priest ripped his outer garments, saying; He has blasphemed! What further need do we have of witnesses? See! Now you have heard the blasphemy. (Matthew 26:65)

[Question] How did the High Priest feel, when Jesus admitted that he was the Messiah, when under oath?

5. On this account, indeed, the Jews began seeking all the more to kill him, because not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was also calling God his own Father, making himself equal to God. (John 5:18)

[Question] Why did the Jews seek all the more to kill Jesus, for what did they think he was trying to do?

6. Who, although he was existing in God's form, gave no

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consideration to a seizure, namely, that he should be equal to God. (Philippians 2:6)

[Question] What though, does the scripture say about Jesus' attitude, respecting becoming Yehowah God's equal?

[Question] Was Jesus though, created in the same form of Yehowah God in the beginning of creation, and would this truly make him Yehowah God's Son?
