

**John 11:19~** Accordingly many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary, in order to console them, concerning their brother.

- 1· Accordingly many of the Jews from Jerusalem had come out to comfort Mary and Martha, and to console them concerning their brother's recent death.

**[Question]** Who was there at the house of Martha and Mary, and what were they doing there?

- 2· And Ephraim their father carried on mourning for many days, and his **brothers** kept coming in to comfort him. (**1 Chronicles 7:22**)

**[Question]** How long did Ephraim mourn over his dead ones?

- 3· And three companions of Job got to hear of all this calamity that had **come** upon him, and they proceeded to **come**, each one from his own place, Eliphaz the Temanite and Bildad the Shuhite and Zophar the Naamathite. So they met together by appointment, to **come** and sympathize with him, and comfort him. (**Job 2:11**)

**[Question]** Where did Job's three companions come from, and what did they do upon hearing of his plight?

- 4· Therefore the **Jews** that were with her in the house and that were consoling her, on seeing **Mary** rise quickly and go out, followed her, supposing that she was going to the memorial tomb to weep there. (**John 11:31**)

**[Question]** What did many of the Jews in the house with Mary do, upon seeing her rise and leave the house?
